Dear Nobles and Ladies,

Thank you Randy Slapak and Tim Mason for the work you do. In most cases, each percent of a burn a child has equals a one day stay at the hospital. So for example, if a child is burned over 35% of his body, his minimum stay would most likely be 35 days. Not only do we take care of the child, but we take care of his/her parents and reassure them everything will be okay. Because of you and your work, these parents have a peace of mind that someone cares. As Shriners, we've made this happen over a million times.

On April 15th, Al Menah lost a great Shriner, Rick Rider. He was a great friend, father, husband, grandfather and also a great friend. Rick loved being a Shriner and never missed a paper sale. He worked the Circus and our Patient's Christmas party. In the short time Rick was a Shriner, he brought in 8 men that have made great Shriners. It is simple, just ask someone to be a Shriner. Please find one to fill your shoes and one to help Al Menah grow.

Sixteen-year-old Abigail Herron of Cleveland, Tenn., has been dancing classical ballet for 12 years. In 2013, she experienced a stress fracture in her left fibula (the outer bone in the leg between the knee and the ankle). Abigail spent 6 weeks in a walking boot, then she went back to dancing.

A year and a half later, Abigail was preparing for a performance of "The Nutcracker" when she developed another stress fracture in her left fibula. Again, her doctor put her in a walking boot for 6 weeks and prescribed physical therapy. He suggested that she stop dancing.

Motivated by her love of dancing and determined to continue, Abigail completed physical therapy and returned to dancing. She was even selected for a program with the prestigious Joffrey Ballet School in New York.

In August 2015, while attending a dance program at the University of Alabama, Abigail began experiencing trouble with her lower left leg again. Doctors at the University Medical Center in Tuscaloosa, Ala., found no fracture. They too said she should stop dancing.

Billy Herron, Abigail's father and an Alhambra Shriner, contacted Shriners Hospitals for Children — Lexington for a second opinion, and Abigail was referred to Ryan Muchow, M.D., pediatric orthopaedic surgeon.

"A lot of people think of us when it comes to chronic orthopaedic conditions, such as scoliosis, clubfoot or hip dysplasia," said Dr. Muchow, "but they don't realize we also care for fracture patients. The effect of a child's growth on a fracture creates a unique situation where specialty and expertise make the difference in ensuring the best outcome. It's important to trust this care to practitioners who are experienced with children and the specific way pediatric fractures are treated."

After X-rays and blood work, no fractures were found – only soft tissue injuries. Dr. Muchow prescribed physical therapy and a few follow-up visits to ensure her leg was healing appropriately. Most importantly, he didn't tell her to stop dancing. "Every other physician told us to quit," said Herron. "We're so thankful for Dr. Muchow."

"Even though it was a long drive to Lexington, it was worth it," said Abigail. "Everyone who helped me there was so nice and caring, and they wanted me to get back to 100 percent as soon as possible."


