News & World Report Recognizes Shriners Hospitals for Children

Shriners Hospitals for Children's national reputation for expertise in pediatric health continues to grow, as shown by its presence in U.S. News & World Report's 2015-2016 rankings of the best children's hospitals in the United States:

- Shriners Hospitals for Children Salt Lake City (together with Primary Childre Hospital) was ranked 10th best in pediatric orthopaedics.
- Shriners Hospitals for Children St. Louis (together with St. Louis Children's Hospital-Washington University), was ranked 11th in pediatric orthopaedics.
- Shriners Hospitals for Children Northern California (together with UC Davis Children's Hospital) was ranked 29th in pediatric orthopaedics, and 20th in pediatric urology.

The rankings are listed online and will be published in the U.S. News & World ReportBest Hospitals 2016 guidebook, which will be available September 1. Hospitals' scores relied on patient outcomes and care-related resources each hospital makes availab To gather data, U.S. News and World Report sent a clinical questionnaire to 184 pediatr hospitals. A sixth of the score came from annual surveys of pediatric specialists and subspecialists in 2013, 2014 and 2015. They were asked where they would send the sickest children in their specialty, setting aside location and expense.

Don't Let the Hall Fall!



The Historic Franklin Masonic Hall remains one of only surviving examples of early Gothic Revival architecture in Middle Tennessee. Its c. 1823 to 1826 three storied masonry construction made it the tallest building in Franklin until the Civil War and served a dual purpose; the first floor became Franklin's first public meeting space and the second and third, reserved for the Masons. It witnessed the formation of all major religious denominations in the town and became the epicenter for commerce, politics, law, and agriculture until 1860.

The Hall became a staging area for Confederates regiments, an observation post, and gathering place local women congregated to sew uniforms in late spring 1861. Following the horrific Battle of Franklin, November 30, 1864, the Hall served as a Federal field hospital.

News from Cincinnati Specialty care beyond a burn

Have a Safer Summer with these Tips from Cincinnati Shriners Hospital

School is almost out and summer is nearly upon us. The weather is warm and children have a lot more free time to spend outdoors. Along with this time of year comes an extra dose of responsibility for parents and adults. Keep your family safe and healthy this summer by following these safety tips from Shriners Hospitals for Children® – Cincinnati.

FIREWORKS SAFETY:

Fourth of July is traditionally celebrated around the country with fireworks. Every year, children and adults alike are injured and hospitalized with fireworks injuries. Mishandled fireworks can result in severe and painful burns, scars, and disfigurements that can last a lifetime.





Below are some tips to help you and your family have a safe summer:

- Obey all local laws regarding the use of fireworks.
- Only use fireworks outdoors, free of overhead obstructions and away from dry grass or other flammable materials.
- Always have a bucket of water and a charged water hose nearby.
- Never give fireworks to young children, including sparklers. Sparklers are thought to be safe for children to use, however these fireworks can reach temperatures above 1,000 degrees Fahrenheit. Only mere seconds of contact can catch clothing on fire or cause third degree burns.
- Wear safety glasses when shooting fireworks.
- Dispose of spent fireworks by wetting them down and placing them in a metal trash can away from any building or combustible materials.

The safest way to handle fireworks is not at all. Families should consider attending community fireworks displays handled by professionals rather than using fireworks at home.

Other summer safety hazards include animals and lawn equipment. ANIMAL SAFETY

- Never leave a young child unsupervised with an animal. Accidents happen even with the most trustworthy children and pets.
- Never approach any animal, even your own, when he or she is eating, sleeping, chewing on a toy, in its crate or caring for its young.
- Always pet an animal gently, with no pulling or tugging, and never from behind.
- Don't make loud noises or sudden moves when approaching an animal.
- Always ask an adult before approaching an animal you don't know.

LAWNMOWER SAFETY

- Children younger than 16 years old should not be allowed to use riding mower. Children under 12 years old should not use walk-behind mowers.
- Wear appropriate shoes and clothing.
- Never smoke or use any type of flame around gasoline.
- Gasoline has one purpose to fuel an engine.

Shriners Play a Big Role in Referrals

When it comes to finding medical help for children, Shriners are now more important than ever. 
