



News from Cincinnati

Now is the Season for Summer Safety Awareness

Every year, kids cannot wait until the summer season arrives. School is over, the weather is warmer and there is a lot more free time to spend outside. But along with this time of year comes an extra dose of responsibility for parents. Keep your family safe and healthy this summer by following these safety tips offered to you from Shriners Hospitals for Children® - Cincinnati:

FIREWORKS SAFETY



- Fireworks that are thought to be safe, like sparklers, can reach temperatures above 1000 degrees and can burn users and bystanders
- Mishandled fireworks can result in severe burns, scars and disfigurements that can last a lifetime
- Families should attend community fireworks displays handled by professionals rather than using fireworks at home

LAWNMOWER SAFETY

- Only use a mower with a control that stops the mower blade from moving if the handle is let go
- Children younger than 16 years old should not be allowed to use ride-on mower. Children under 12 years old should not use walk-behind mowers
- Wear appropriate shoes and clothing
- · Never smoke or use any type of flame around gasoline
- · Gasoline has one purpose to fuel an engine

DOG SAFETY



- Consult with a professional to learn what breeds of dogs are the best fit for your household
- Dogs with histories of aggression are not suitable for households with children
- Be sensitive to cues that a child is fearful or apprehensive about a dog. If a child seems frightened by dogs, wait before bringing a dog into your household
- Spend time with a dog before buying or adopting it. Use caution when bringing a dog into a household with an infant or toddler.

Summer should be a fun time, not a scary time, but it also shouldn't be spent in a hospital. By taking these few extra measures, parents can make sure their children have a safe, happy and healthy summer.
