WCJC HOLDS COMMENCEMENT EXERCISES

WHARTON, TEXAS – Wharton County Junior College recently held its 70th Annual Commencement Exercises for graduates receiving either an associate of arts degree, an associate of applied science degree or the associate of arts in teaching degree. Two ceremonies were held on Saturday, May 14, with associate of arts graduates receiving diplomas at 10 a.m. and associate of applied science graduates walking across the stage at 2 p.m. More than 230 graduates participated in the two ceremonies.

A special commencement address was provided by Dr. Belle Wheelan, President of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges. In her address, Wheelan spoke of the advances made in technology, entertainment, politics and civil rights in the 1970s – when she earned her bachelor's and master's degrees – and compared them with what's been done in those fields today.

This award is presented annually to a graduate based on excellence in leadership, scholarship, participation in extracurricular activities and the promise of future achievement. Igbokwe, an Associate of Arts degree recipient, further won a Dean's Award for maintaining a perfect 4.0 grade point average.

Two other students also received Dean's Awards. These were Matthew Krenek of Richmond and Christopher Reyes of Bay City, both of whom graduated with Associate of Applied Science degrees.

The Outstanding Service Award – which is presented to the graduate who best exemplifies a spirit of service to the college and the community – was presented to Jacqueline Hernandez of Rosenberg.

The WCJC Award for Excellence in Teaching was presented to mathematics instructor Jennifer Mauch. The award recognizes full-time faculty who have dedicated themselves to making a difference in the lives of their students.
