WHO: 100 Licensed Early Childhood Education Centers/Homes!

You're entrusted by families with the care and well-being of their children. That puts you in the position to make a pivotal difference in their lives by helping them form positive nutrition and physical activity habits while in your care.

WHAT: PA Nutrition and Physical Activity Self-Assessment for Child Care (PA NAP SACC)

PA NAP SACC is an interactive, easy-to-use online tool that provides professional development for child care administrators and their staff. This completely web-based process includes self-assessment, action planning, implementation, post-self-assessment, and reflection. The implementation process includes free, online professional development opportunities in CBK knowledge area 7 (K7): Health, Safety and Nutrition that once completed, become part of your transcript on the Registry.

WHERE: Online!

In addition to online resources, all programs will have access to technical assistance from Tuscarora Intermediate Unit, as well as support from the Early Childhood Education Linkage System, related to policy development and improvement plans. A limited number of programs will receive on-site, targeted technical assistance from a Child Care Health Consultant (CCHC) at no cost to the site. The CCHC will review current practices and policies, assist with developing sustainable policies, and offer guidance for continuous quality improvement.

WHEN: Applications are due by August 28, 2016!

The Child Care Wellness Mini-grant Project will follow the timeline below:

- Applications due by August 28, 2016
- Notification of Acceptance September 14, 2016
- Orientation and Kick-off in late September/early October
- Have 8-9 months to implement!

• Reflection and wrap up in June

WHY: Early childhood educators can be pivotal in guiding the course of a child's health and wellness.

Beyond the reward of making a difference in the health of the children in your care, participants also receive a \$500 mini grant to support their action steps and enhance their nutrition and physical activity practices.
