Program Details

- Gain a better understanding of the importance of engineering in social and community development
- Learn community-based approaches in identifying communal needs and appropriate solutions.
- Explore topics in sustainability, public health, project design, and appropriate technologies.
- Become acquainted with Ethiopia's customs, history, geography, and language, through fieldwork, guided tours, cultural activities and work with locals.
- Engage in hands-on activities involving appropriate technologies such as solar energy, wind power, water filtration, compressed earth blocks, fuel briquettes, and/or bio-reactors.
- Experience hands-on practices and tools for **sustainable community development** working alongside Technion faculty and international staff and peers in Ethiopia.
- Join peers from Israel, Ethiopia and other universities around the world and earn Technion academic credits!

Program Cost: \$4,500*
