The intersection of music and ministry  
marks and defines Dick & Mel Tunney.

The Tunneys will be with us Sunday through Tuesday to share music as  
we meet each evening. **Monday evening has been set aside for a concert  
with the Tunneys. Expect to worship and leave encouraged.**

Both were raised in Christian homes, Dick in Ohio and Mel the daughter of  
a minister of music in Texas. Their early training and experience laid the  
groundwork for a lifetime of musical ministry that has many facets.

The thread of songwriting has gone through the Tunneys nearly 35 years  
of marriage and their songs have been recorded by Christian artists, been  
found in printed music projects, musicals and even hymnals. The Tun-  
neys have received 10 Dove Awards (Christian music's highest honor),  
several Grammy award nominations and their song, "How Excellent is Thy  
Name" (co-written with Paul Smith and recorded by Larnelle Harris) received  
a prestigious Grammy Award. Dick has also served as pianist and musical  
director for the Imperials, and currently travels with Steve Green Ministries,  
and serves as Musical Director for the "God of All Glory Tour" which features  
Christian artists Wayne Watson, Twila Paris, Larnelle Harris and Steve Green.  
Mel currently serves in local church ministry as worship pastor and lends  
her voice in studio recordings and First Call reunion concerts.

In 2015 Dick and Mel will celebrate 35 years of marriage. The Tunneys'  
older daughter Whitney, her husband Shawn, and children Liam and Lane,  
live in Raleigh, North Carolina where Shawn is on the worship staff of a  
local church. Their younger daughter, Kelsey, her husband Zach, and their  
three children Charis, Siloam and Elijah, are located in Cleveland, Ohio  
where Zach serves as youth pastor at North Olmsted Friends Church.
