

§205.204 Seeds and planting stock

Annual seedlings must be organically grown

An exception may be made only if a variety or its equivalent is commercially unavailable.

Organic seeds must be used for organic edible sprouts, with no exceptions.

Seeds cannot be treated with prohibited substances.

Genetically engineered seeds, planting stock, and seed inoculants are prohibited.




