# 2016 -2017 AIA South Carolina Leadership Development Academy

### **ABSTRACT:**

The AIA South Carolina Leadership Development Academy is designed to prepare AIA|SC Emerging Professionals for future leadership roles through broadening the opportunities for participants to obtain leadership skills and mentoring, both of which are vital to discovery and growth as a professional and as an individual. The program will bring together Emerging and Experienced Professionals, allowing each participant to benefit from the mutual exchange of ideas and knowledge, and offering a forum in which the specific needs of Emerging Professionals can be discussed and addressed. The program also serves to provide contacts and relationships, opportunities for personal exposure in the local community, and a venue for the presentation of broad professional perspectives. These varied benefits will help guide Emerging Professionals throughout their career. The involvement and active participation from community leaders, local architecture firms, and associated professions further reinforces the far-reaching approach of the program.

#### **PURPOSE and DESCRIPTION**

The AIA South Carolina Leadership Development Academy consists of seven individual sessions attended by approximately 12 participants. Sessions are held in Columbia, SC, at the offices of AIA South Carolina. Prospective participants must go through an application process for selection where proven career success, community involvement and the individual's firm support will be considered.

The purpose of this local component leadership development program is to:

- accelerate development of the next generation of architect leaders to benefit the profession, local architectural firms, and area communities;
- expose participants to all areas of architecture practice;
- accelerate the acquisition of knowledge required for successful practice; and
- · equip architects to be contributing members of their profession, their firms, and their communities

Participants consider the leadership qualities inherent in good design, team-building, project delivery, firm management, communities, advocacy, and economics. The program helps participants understand the relationship amongst personal, professional and firm leadership requirements. The curriculum focuses on core professional skills such as entrepreneurship and firm management, working together and collaboration, the art of negotiation, client development, community leadership, industry trends, and practice development.

#### **PROGRAM FEATURES:**

- Mix of speakers and workshops to cover leadership topics and encourage discussion
- Class participants will include both Associates and Young Architects
- Competitively selected group of 12 emerging professionals based on both their past experience and their probability of future involvement in professional and community service
- Seven individual sessions once each month
- Project work-time incorporated into each session and into dedicated workdays
- Highly relevant topics and well-qualified speakers
- · Effective, year-long format to develop understanding of principles from sessions
- · Interaction with clients, contractors, developers, bankers, lawyers, and other professionals
- Exposure and first-hand knowledge of firms practicing all over the state
- Nimble responsiveness to current community and professional needs.
- Focuses on core skills not part of an emerging professional's typical work day
- Engages cooperative efforts of architecture firms within the component
- Promotes a legacy of leadership and activism

#### ATA CONTINUING EDUCATION:

It is intended that this program will have AIA CE credit available for its participants.

#### **CURRICULUM:**

The curriculum will focus on core skills such as marketing and business development, office and firm management, presentation and public speaking, professional ethics and the law, philanthropy and board involvement, community service, industry trends, and the future of the practice. A full list of courses is described below.

Each individual session will be planned by members of the program and the program will be kicked off by a "Boot Camp" session to introduce the participants and design the curriculum for the year. Each member will be responsible to lead the planning of at least one session. Sessions will be held monthly from 10:00am – 4:00pm, October through April.
