RE: Key Poll Findings – CA-31 General Election

Data show California's 31st Congressional District is extremely competitive. Democrats lead the generic ballot by just one point and the incumbent Pete Aguilar is tied with Paul Chabot at 43% for each candidate.

Q: If the election for United States Congress were held today, would you vote for the Republican candidate or the Democratic candidate?

Democrat: 46% Republican: 45% Undecided: 9%

Q: The candidates in the General Election for United States Congress are:

Paul Chabot, Prefers Republican Party, Counterterrorism Military Officer, and, Pete Aguilar, Prefers Democratic Party, United States Representative

If the election were held today, for whom would you vote? [ROTATE]

Paul Chabot: 43% Pete Aguilar: 43% Undecided: 14%

Terrorism and National Security have become a key issue for likely voters in the district with 22% of likely voters saying it should be Congress' top priority.



Q: What do you believe should be the top priority for Congress?

Jobs & Economy: 31%

Terrorism & National Security: 22%

Immigration: 7%
Border Security: 7%
Education: 7%

Budget & Deficit: 4% Healthcare: 3%

Taxes: 2%

Something else: 3%

Unsure: 13%

The key data indicating a Republican pickup opportunity is that Non-Partisan or Decline to State voters favor Paul Chabot over Pete Aguilar by eight points.
