 - April is a heavy month for expenses. Anticipate about \$8k left in cash by end of month. Rev Eric suggested asking for some kind of amnesty rather than having to pay 9 months all at once, when it is the pension fund's fault we are stuck here.
 - Rev Eric our financial situation is based on larger problem with identity and culture. Don't panic. Develop a message and prepare to deliver it.

Rev. Eric – we can say all these comments about the Church too. Christmas,

Easter, Antique Show, Oktoberfest are the four seasons here. Remember the four questions to ask about the value or programming in a church:

- Whose lives were transformed?
- Was new leadership equipped?
- Were relationships strengthened?
- Was making it happen joyful?

These are questions about the Church, not just about the event.

Vicki – I recognize there are different feelings about the show.

- Vicki There are several ways the vestry can support the next antique show:
 - If we go to a Sat/Sun show, we would need Rev. Eric's support to perhaps go to one service, and be OK with the furniture being in the church. Rev. Eric said we have to have some other discussions with Education and Worship committees before a decision can be made.
 - Professional kitchen cleaning and pest control of the kitchen. Cost is \$1,000 or so.
 - Mailing list centrally managed.
 - CAD drawing of spaces for booths. Jen V said Griffin could help Randy V with this.
