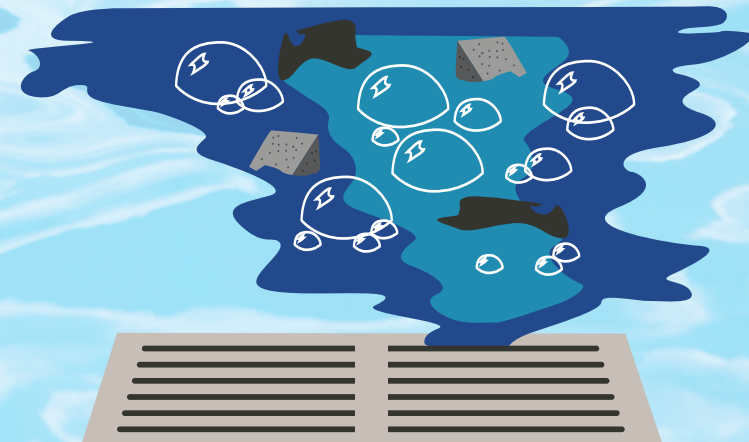

★ The stormwater system is a separate pipe network to the sewer system. Whatever goes into these pipes flows straight into the waterways - with no filtering and no treatment.



🚫 Don't wash your car on the driveway or in the street.

✅ Wash your car on the lawn or on gravel - better still use a commercial car wash where all the waste water goes to sewer.



✅ Take care when using fertilizer or pesticides in the garden.



✅ Check that no oil from your car ends up on the driveway.



✅ Don't let building materials blow away or be washed down into the drains.



🚫 Never wash paint rollers and brushes under a garden tap.



🚫 Don't leave any litter lying around, including animal droppings.
