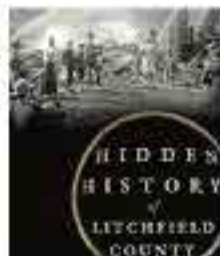


Philosophy of Happiness: Ancient Wisdom for Modern Times
