SIA's David Ingemie To Be Inducted into the U.S. Ski and Snowboard Hall of Fame



SIA President David Ingemie will be inducted into the U.S. Ski and Snowboard Hall of Fame next April.

Joining David in the Class of 2015 are freestyle skiing world champions Genia Fuller and Bob Salerno; veteran magazine publisher Henry Kaiser; Olympic snowboarding medalist Chris Klug; adaptive skiing innovator Jim Martinson, and the late Edgar Stern who developed Deer Valley Resort.

The induction will take place April 9, 2016 at Aspen's St. Regis Aspen Resort. The class will also be formally enshrined into the Hall of Fame in September 2016 in Ishpeming, MI, the home of the U.S. Ski and Snowboard Hall of Fame.

David began his career at the age of 13, working in his local ski shop, the Ski Barn, in Fitchburg, MA. Eventually, he moved on to become Marketing Director at Wachusett Mountain in Princeton, MA, and then was tapped to become Executive Director of New Hampshire's Mt. Washington Valley Association. In 1976, SIA's president, Doc DesRoches, convinced David to join SIA as Director of Marketing, and the SIA Board of Directors promoted him to president when Doc retired in 1981.
