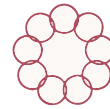


# OLDMAN WATERSHED COUNCIL STUDENT INTERNS IN THE HEADWATERS SUMMER /FALL 2015

The Oldman Watershed Council (OWC) hired two student interns in the summer and fall of 2015 to lead outreach activities in the Crown of the Continent. Rowan is a Political Science undergraduate student and Adam is a graduate student in Environmental Science. Their main responsibility was to build relationships with off highway vehicle users and backcountry campers on public land in the Oldman watershed. They did a great job and were a critical part of the project.



They were also responsible for promoting and participating in two riparian restoration events, one along Hidden Creek and one along Dutch Creek.
