Cows and Fish is looking to fill a position, based in Calgary, focusing on the Grassland and Foothills, with some work in the Parkland Natural Region, but also working to a lesser extent across the province. The position will be full time, for approximately a 1 year term, covering for leave of an existing staff member.

As part of the Alberta Riparian Habitat Management Society-"Cows and Fish", a self directed and motivated person will provide: provincial support to other staff through expertise in riparian ecology and range science; regional and local support to watershed / stewardship / community groups, landowners and resource agencies regarding riparian ecology and management. You will take part in coordinating and implementing community based and riparian health activities with emphasis on southern Alberta, based out of our Calgary office. You will work directly in riparian health and management extension, including grazing and other land uses, with communities, landowners and livestock producers. Urban riparian health and management will be in integral part of your work with landowners, municipalities and other groups.

Qualifications:

Familiarity with riparian health evaluation methods, riparian ecology, vegetation community interactions, superior plant identification, forage production, soils, computers and photography required. Experience working with community groups and landowners and writing funding proposals valued. You must have demonstrated strong interpersonal, written and oral presentation communication skills. Social media use and website design and maintenance experience are an asset. You will have a B.Sc. with a major related to environmental science, conservation or range ecology. Eligibility for P.Ag. (Alberta Institute of Agrologists) or P. Biol. (Alberta Society of Professional Biologists) required. The successful candidate must have a minimum of 2 years of practical applied work experience in extension, riparian or range management or relevant research. Education or experience related to biology/ecological processes and hydrology is required. Practical knowledge of riparian planning, management and restoration, grazing management design, or designing and developing grazing strategies is expected as part of your previous experience.

Position will ideally begin early March 2016, although other start dates will be considered. Candidates must have a valid class 5 driver's license, be willing to do extensive travel (with long days), including overnight away from home and work outdoors in a field setting.
