I read the newspaper every day, two books book about schools, and To Kill a Mockingbird by Harper Lee. I read Harper Lee's new book before vacation so I decided to read Mockingbird again. The book is about legal justice and how unfairly Black people were treated in Alabama in the 30's.

Anyway, my vacation was good. Hope yours was too.

Sunday I came to school to make sure everything was ok. Dave, Adam, and Jeremiah did some serious cleaning while we were gone. The building looks good.

The tulips by our new addition are coming up and it looks like all the daylilies we planted in the parking lot last fall made it. They'll look great in a month.

The end of our year is looking great.

Carole Humphrey will be teaching art lessons again. We've missed her since she broke her hip. I can't wait to see your newest creations.

The Imagination/ Inventor's fair is a week from today. What a great chance to learn about something

I'm not sure what you know about our fifth grade exhibition, but in IB schools all over the world, 5th graders present a final demonstration of their best learning. Our fifth graders have been learning about Sharing the Planet and on May 12th they will show us and our parents what they have learned. It should be extraordinary.

You've been doing a great job learning how to read. Keep up the good work. Reading makes you knowledgeable you know. The more you read the more you know. The better you read, the harder the stuff you can read. The more you know the more knowledgeable you get. Read at school. Read at home. Read at soccer. Read at the swimming pool. Read before supper.
