Youth Protection Online Training

(Course takes approx. 40 minutes to complete.)

You don't have to already be a registered member of Boy Scouts or have a BSA member ID to take Youth Protection Training online.

If you are already registered with the BSA, make sure your BSA ID # is entered in your profile page of the myscouting.org website so that your online training info. will be recorded in your Scout data file. To do this, log into MyScouting, click My Profile, and enter your member ID number. This links your Youth Protection training, and any other MyScouting training, to your BSA membership. Your BSA ID # is on your membership card, and if you don't have your card available, you can obtain this # by calling the Scout Service Center in Kokomo at 800-844-0537 or 765-452-8253.

Instructions:

Go to <u>www.myscouting.org</u> and sign in with your user name and password. If you do not have these you may create an account so that you will. Once you are logged in, you will see a menu on the left side of the home page screen.

- 1. From the menu on the left, click E-Learning.
- 2. Scroll down the page and select either the General tab (for new or unregistered adults) or the specific Scouting program in which you participate (current or registered adults), and find Youth Protection Training. Click this link and take the course.
- 3. When you complete the course, print a certificate of completion for your records.

If you are applying to be a new adult volunteer you may submit the printed certificate to the Council or to the unit leader with your application for processing at the local council. When your volunteer application is approved, you will receive a BSA membership card, which includes your member ID number. You must enter this member ID into your MyScouting profile so that your local council has a record of the training you have taken online. To do this, log into MyScouting, click My Profile, enter your member ID number and click "Add." This links your Youth Protection training, and any other MyScouting training, to your BSA membership.
