NHRW FEBRUARY LUNCHEON - CHARLES C. JOHNSON, GUEST SPEAKER BY ANITA MEISTER-BOYD

What if everyday people could be connected with experts and sources to break news and get rewarded for their effort? This is the mission of *Gotnews.com* -- to make common people seekers of the truth and producers of the news in order ultimately to confront the Left in media, academia, and government. The concept is the brainchild of Charles C. Johnson, our February luncheon guest speaker, who was mentored by the late Andrew Breitbart.

Though only 26 years old, Johnson already has had quite a journalistic impact. As a result of his collaborations, he concluded that Lois Lerner's growing visibility at various functions made her a window to the IRS. Research revealed that Lerner not only granted tax-exempt foundation status to the Barack H. Obama Foundation, headed by the President's half brother, but fast-tracked it to approval in record time within a month of filing. Conversely, Tea Party groups were peppered with pages of questions and made to wait years for approval. IRS abuses didn't stop there. Within the government, a computer wiz designed a program with the capability of pulling up a spreadsheet and accessing any individual. It became clear to Johnson that IRS data could be leaked and quite often had been, with the sharing of data across different branches of government. This was true in particular for groups opposing gay marriage. Johnson characterized these new IRS assaults as a reaction of the Left to the Citizens United decision and the fear that if they did not restrict the Tea Party movement, Obama would not be able to accomplish his aggressive agenda. In his book, "The Truth About the IRS Scandals," Johnson discusses the increasing damage the IRS can do to its enemies because of modern technology.

More recently, with his team of everyday "reporters," Johnson is credited with exposing the Brian-Williamsdead-body-floating-in-the-French-Quarter tall tale, the twittering frenzy that forced retraction of a University of Virginia student's false rape accusation (designed to end due process rights on campuses), and the publicizing of two New York Times reporters' addresses in retribution for their publishing the innocent Ferguson cop's address. While it is obvious that Johnson is no friend of mainstream media and liberal causes (in December alone, there were four "hit" pieces written about him by the New York Times, Washington Post, Gawker, and Mother Jones), he also finds himself an object of Republican ridicule, for his breaking news on the Cochran campaign pay-for-votes scheme and the racist flyers against McDaniels in the Mississippi Senate race, and for his condemnation of the Republican Party which has never held the IRS accountable for its targeting of individuals and groups, and which he says has learned to care about the IRS scandal only after Republicans realized they could use it to raise money.

Johnson is encouraged by the success of Gotnews in disseminating truth to a receptive audience. He trusts in American ingenuity to get around the newly announced FCC net neutrality regulations, but believes these regulations ultimately will be reversed in court. Between paper trail, videos and digital content, so much information is available that anyone can participate in news gathering and production, such as in the leaks of the Jonathan Gruber videos, and he encouraged us to participate, stating that all it takes is passion and persistence to uncover the truth. He envisions a new type of news consumer -- one that is skeptical about politics, government and the dishonest manner in which the war on terror has been framed; and one that will not wait for news reports on snail-like mainstream media but instead will do his/her own fact checking using high-level Internet research, and tools to encrypt and understand the credibility of source documents. Millennials are already well suited to these roles, as they get their news almost exclusively from the Internet; and Johnson expects their skepticism over Obama and the government to grow as details of Obama's sordid past are leaked with more frequency as he approaches the exit door. One of the greatest challenges Johnson perceives in his new platform is developing a recipe for conveying information in an emotional narrative appealing to human beings living in the real world.

Similar to James O'Keefe's model, the citizen-journalist will be required to have a querrilla warfare mindset. Mainstream media is a business whose purpose is to set the narrative, suppressing the truth. We need to figure out how to replace the media as a business. From the economic side, Johnson quickly concludes that over time, mainstream media is just not cost-competitive because it can't break and produce news on the kind of shoestring budget that an army of citizen-journalists can, nor can it survive when the citizen-journalist army produces refuting documents in real time debunking the mainstream narrative they just spent the whole day developing. Johnson believes the next step in dismantling mainstream media will be to go on the attack with mega-leaks challenging the ability of the government to lie, such as the West Anglia emails showing global warming alarmists were lying.

Dear Editor,

Six U.C.I. students, all in a governing position at the university, created a firestorm when they voted to remove the American flag from the student governing lobby. As soon as that information was leaked, the public, as well as some U.C.I. students, responded with an understandable outrage. People wanted to know more about those students and the reasons they wanted to remove our nation's flag.

Within days, we learned the identities of the six students who voted for the removable: Negar Fatahi, Mathew Guevara, Mathew Tsai, Naty Rico, Khaaldah Sidney, and John Salazar. While they and the university are now backtracking with excuses for their action, the proof of their intentions can be seen in the document they submitted, which outlined their reasoning for the flag removal. The following is just one of twenty negatives they listed, but it is enough to allow us a window into their reasoning. They stated: "Flags not only serve as symbols of patriotism or weapons for nationalism, but also construct cultural mythologies and narratives that in turn charge nationalistic sentiments." Really? I was taught and have come to know our American flag as a symbol of liberty, freedom, and democracy. To most Americans it represents the spirit of our people and fills us with pride whenever we stand and salute "Old Glory".

Could the students' lack of patriotism have originated from their home, their families? Were these young adults born and raised in America, or are they foreign students loyal to their home country? Or, are the six students' 20 complaints against our flag due to what they have been taught at U.C.I. by their professors? U.C.I. and other American universities are gaining a reputation for becoming "islands of liberal indoctrination", due to the growing number of professors who lean Left. Further proof of a liberal bias can be found in who the schools invite as graduation speakers. The top 100 universities in America prefer left leaning commencement speakers by a ratio of seven-to-one. It is not surprising to learn that same seven-to-one ratio has been the trend in hiring liberal leaning professors over conservatives.

The obvious question and concern is whether U.C.I. professors and others in prestigious universities are guilty of transferring their liberal philosophy into classrooms where they tend to indoctrinate rather than teach vulnerable students. An article in the L.A. The solution may be for taxpayers, parents, and students to request fair hiring practices, which in turn will provide students the opportunity to hear and learn a more balanced and open-minded political perspective; one in which all will benefit.
