We want to bring to your attention that the Wood Grain Powder Coat finish color Golden Maple has been discontinued by the vendor. We have identified a similar Maple color/pattern that we are now introducing to the Wood Grain Powder Coat color selection. The new color is Light Maple, which features the wood grain pattern of Maple but is a few shades lighter in color. Keep in mind the pictures below are both maple wood grain pattern, however the chips are cut from different sections of the full pattern so the pattern doesn't look the same in the comparison.

We have reached out to those who have ordered the Golden Maple color chips and will replace them with the new Light Maple color chip.
