Many of our children have strengths and abilities but not all are formally identified as gifted.

Some children have asynchronous development which means they have profound strengths in some areas but not others. This can create a confusing profile and challenges. Parents, grandparents and guardians play an important role in the life of their child and parenting a gifted or asynchronous learner can be both perplexing and lonely at times.

SENG groups are structured to bring together 10-20 parents in a relaxed setting to discuss topics such as motivation, peer relationships, and stress management. It's an opportunity to share ideas, strategies, and support while guided by SENG-trained Facilitators. We focus on positive parenting, avoiding power struggles, developing life skills, and enhancing relationships. **Sessions are Wednesdays, 6.00 – 7.30 pm.**
