About the Conference Center:

Fellowship Conference Center is nestled on the shores of Lake Greenwood, SC offering a haven for people seeking retreat from the everyday cares of life. The guest rooms are spacious and each have 2 or 3 twin beds. The property is spread over one mile of waterfront on the lake. It includes a Dining Hall, a Conference Center with accommodations for up to 32 guests, great decks, porches, pavilions and overlooks with comfortable porch rockers. There is good cell phone reception at the Center. It is located in Laurens County, just off of SC Hwy 72. WiFi is free and available.

The Retreat Fee Includes:

- 3 days, 2 nights' accommodations (2 single beds per private room) with private baths in each room. Bed and bath linens provided. Single or double occupancy rates available, your choice.
- 5 meals
- All materials needed for the knit-along, including your yarn, pattern and instruction. After you register, you will be instructed about what type/size knitting needles to bring with you to the retreat.
- Coffee and bottled water are provided. Adult beverages are permitted at the Conference Center if you wish to BYOB.

Need to Bring:

- Please bring an item to add to our snack area (homemade or not goodies, sweet or savory).
 A fridge and microwave are provided. If you wish, you may bring soft drinks (cans, please) for the fridge.
- Super comfy, casual clothing.
- Completed or unfinished knitting projects for the "Show and Share" event. Please be prepared to tell people the name of the pattern and where it can be found. If you would like to, you might want to bring enough copies (15) of one pattern you have used and will show (must be a free pattern or your own design) to share with the group.
- An orphan skein of yarn (a skein you have and don't plan to use) for a swap
- Your own floor or table lamp if you normally need one to work on your fiber art.
- Anything you want to eat or drink which isn't being provided.
- Whatever ongoing project(s) you want to work on during free time. Knitters, crocheters, spinners and weavers are welcome. If you plan to join the Retreat knit-along, you should know how to Knit, Purl, Cast on and Bind off without help. Those who don't knit or don't wish to join the Retreat KnitAlong will still receive the project yarn to do with as they wish. There is ample room at the Center to set up looms and spinning wheels.
