

Mystery Quilt

PIECE #11 (this week's *Mystery Clue!!!*)

I warned you. This week once again, you will make LOTS of four patches!!

You will make two sets of four patches – one set where the squares in the four patch block will finish at 1 ¼” and the other set where the squares in the four patch block will finish at 1”.

I used two different Civil War prints for each set.

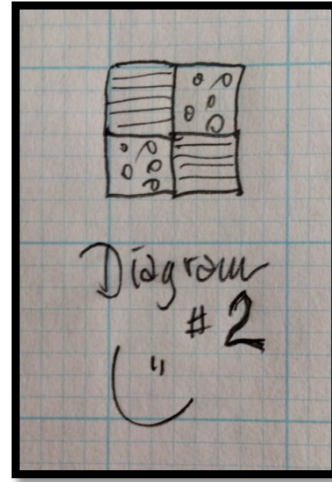
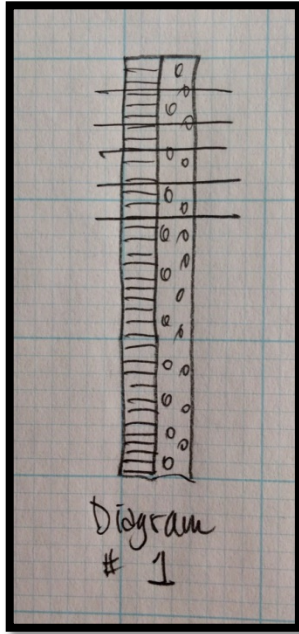
Remember, this is a FREE project!!! You can use your own stash OR, if you are interested, you can purchase a "kit" each time we give you a piece of the *Mystery*. The price of our kits will vary clue to clue depending on the amount of fabric in the kit. The price will be nominal.

For this week, if you decide to purchase our fabrics, you'll receive the four fabrics shown.

To make the FIRST set of Four-Patch blocks, CUT

7 – 1 3/4” strips each of two different Civil War prints (I used red and pink)

Sew **seven** sets together lengthwise. Press open and sub-cut at 1 ¾” to make 152 two-patch units.



Sew these two-patch units together to make 76 four-patch blocks. These blocks should measure 3" square (to finish at 2 ½" square).

MAKE 76 OF THESE FOUR PATCH BLOCKS.

Use this same process to make your second set of Four-Patch blocks.

To make the SECOND set of Four-Patch blocks, CUT:

9 – 1 ½" strips each of two different Civil War prints (I used navy blue and gold)

Sew **nine** sets together lengthwise. Press open and sub-cut at 1 ½" to make 248 two-patch units. Sew these two-patch units together to make 124 four-patch blocks.

These blocks should measure 2 ½" square (to finish at 2" square).

MAKE 124 OF THESE FOUR PATCH BLOCKS.

Once again, you should SAVE THESE TWO SETS OF FOUR-PATCH BLOCKS!

Put them in your *Mystery* Quilt project bag or a plastic baggy! You WILL need these later when we begin putting the *Mystery* all together.
