Mystery Quilt

PIECE #6 (this week's Mystery Piece!!!)

This is the same block you made in PIECE #4 – but REVERSED!


Instead of a *color* center with *shirtings* in the four corners, for this set of snowballs you will use your *shirtings* for the center and the *colors* for the four corners.

To make one set of snowball blocks, CUT:

 $4 - 3 \frac{1}{2}$ " squares from each of the **shirting** fabrics $16 - 1 \frac{1}{2}$ " squares from each **color** fabrics

To make ONE snowball block:

Pair up a 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square of one **shirting** fabric with $4 - 1 \frac{1}{2}$ " squares of one **color** fabric. Draw a pencil line from corner to corner on the back of all $4 - 1 \frac{1}{2}$ " **color** fabric squares. Place one 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " **color** fabric square face-to-face in the corner of a 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " **shirting** fabric square. Sew directly on the pencil line. Trim $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the seam and press open. Repeat this on the remaining three corners of your 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square.



Repeat the process using these same fabrics to make three more snowball blocks – for a total of four identical snowball blocks. You have now made one set of four snowball blocks. Make four more sets of snowball blocks – this will make a total of twenty snowball blocks (five sets of four snowball blocks each). These snowball blocks should measure 3 1/2" square. Once again, save these snowball blocks! It won't be long until we start assembling our Mystery!!!!:)
