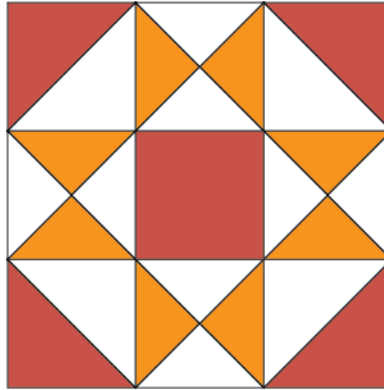


Mystery Quilt #1 - 2016

Clue #10



You will make FOUR of these blocks!!

The BLOCK!

One of my favorite blocks – the Ohio star. It's an easy one to make – and will make a great addition to your quilt! Have FUN making these wonderful stars!

To make ONE block,

From the BACKGROUND FABRIC, CUT:

2 – 3 ½” squares

2 – 3” squares

From FABRIC #1, CUT:

2 – 3 ½” squares

From FABRIC #2, CUT:

2 – 3” squares

1 – 2 ½” squares

Half-Square Triangles

Procedurally, follow the same procedures as you did in CLUE #8 to make four half-square triangles.

Pair up your 4 – 3” squares (2 of your Background Fabric, 2 of Fabric #2).

This will yield four half-square triangles. These half-square triangles will be the four corners of your block.

Trim these Half-Square triangle units to measure 2 ½” square.

Set these aside.

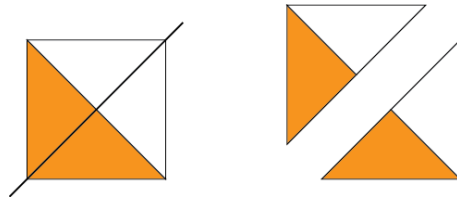
Quarter-Square Triangles

Oh, what fun it is to make quarter-square triangles! These will be the Star Points of your block. Begin by making some more Half-Square triangles.

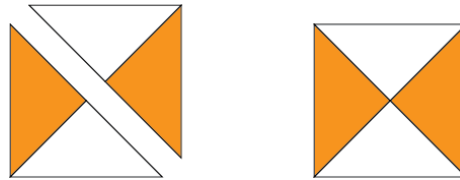
Follow the same procedures you did to make the four corner Half-Square triangle units.

Using your 4 – 3 ½” squares (2 of your Background Fabric, 2 of Fabric #1), make four Half-Square triangle units.

Cut these four Half-Square triangles diagonally through the center as shown:



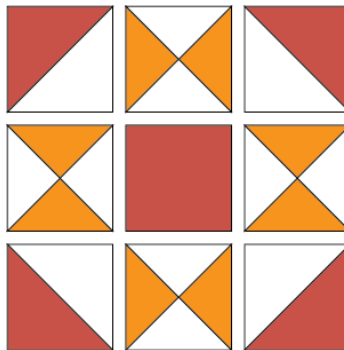
You will end up with eight of these “two-fabric” triangle units.
Pair them up to make your four Star point units. Sew them together.



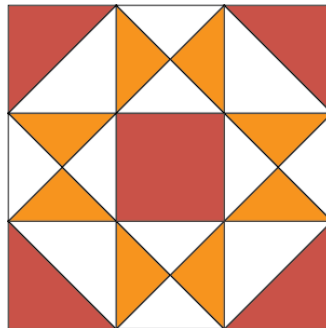
Trim the four Star point units to 2 ½” square.

Block Assembly

Lay out nine-patch fashion – the four Half-Square triangle corner pieces; the four Quarter-Square triangle Star point pieces; and the 2 ½” center square of Fabric #2:



Sew nine patch pieces together to make three rows.
Then sew the rows together to make your block.



Make four of these blocks. Trim these blocks to 6 ½” square.
