# 8:30-9:30 AM: The U.S. Nuclear Waste Program in Reformulation.... Mike McBride, VanNess Feldman

Mike is former external council to the Blue Ribbon Commission, and a current advisor to the Bipartisan Policy Center. As in several recent meetings, he will provide his perspective on the U.S. nuclear waste program in reformulation, considering the legislature (House & Senate), the Federal District Court, the Administration (changes at DOE-NE), and key external forces. There will be time for questions and discussion.

## 9:30-10:30 AM: The U.S. Program in the West

As usual, prospective SNF transport targets the arid West. What's the status and perspective in selected western states?

- The NRC is preparing for YMP licensing, without DOE as an active proponent;
- Energy Solutions has worked through the Utah legislature in efforts to revive the PFS project (which retains its NRC license) on the Goshute Reservation.
- The state of New Mexico has supported the prospective license application for storage of 70,000+ MT SNF on lands owned by Lea & Eddy counties in SE NM.
- The state of Texas has supported the prospective license application for storage of 40,000 MT at WCS, on the Texas-New Mexico border.

As background for subsequent discussion, we will receive short reports on the status of these storage-disposal prospects.
