Rev Dr. Robert Fiedler, Pastor, Covenant PC, Roanoke, VA / Speaker



Bob Fiedler is a native of New Jersey and grew up on the Jersey shore. He migrated south and graduated from the College of William and Mary and Union Presbyterian Seminary. He has served as a campus minister, and as a pastor in North Carolina and Virginia. Currently, Bob is pastor of Covenant Presbyterian in Roanoke, VA. For the past 15 years he has volunteered and served on the board of the Roanoke Jail Ministry which reaches out to inmates in three local jails. He also is player/coach of his church softball team which has flourished with help of "free agents".

Rev. Dr. Chip Hardwick, Director Theology, Formation, and Evangelism, PC(USA), Louisville, KY / Speaker



The Rev. Dr. Charles B. Hardwick has served as the Director of Theology, Formation, and Evangelism for the General Assembly Agency of the Presbyterian Church (USA) since January, 2012. This vital denominational ministry seeks to support congregations and leaders in four areas: theology and worship, congregational ministries publishing, theological education, and interfaith relationships. An ordained PC (USA) pastor, Chip most recently served as Pastor/Head of Staff of Second Presbyterian Church in Bloomington, IL, a congregation of 1,700 members. He has also served a new church development outside of Princeton, NJ; the North Avenue Presbyterian Church in Atlanta, GA; as well as congregations in New York City, London, England, and Madrid, Spain.

Rev. Dr. Richard Keever, Retired Pastor Bayside PC, Virginia Beach, VA. / Worship Leader



Rev. Dr. Richard "Dick" Jenkins Keever answered the call on September 19, 1982. He served on the administrative staff of Union Theological Seminary (UTS) in Richmond, Virginia. At UTS, Dick was the Director of Seminary Relations, Executive Secretary of the UTS Alumni/ae, and Director of Friends of the Seminary. Dick was ordained in Presbyterian Church, U.S. on September 29, 1968 and received his Doctor of Ministry at UTS in 1980. Dr. Keever left Bayside June 2008 after serving here for 26 years. He served the longest of all our Pastors to date. After his retirement from Bayside, Dick moved on to become the chaplain at Westminster-Canterbury retirement center in Virginia Beach.
