Marc Gopin, Ph.D. is the Director of the Center for World Religions, Diplomacy and Conflict Resolution (CRDC) and the James H. Laue Professor at the School for Conflict Analysis and Resolution at George Mason University. At CRDC, Gopin has pioneered peacebuilding projects in Afghanistan, Iran, Syria, Palestine, and Israel and has trained thousands of people worldwide in peacebuilding for complex conflicts. He has also engaged in back-channel diplomacy with religious, political, and military figures on both sides of conflicts. He has written five books and conducts research on values dilemmas as they apply to international problems such as clash of cultures, globalization and development, and social justice.
