



## KHK Heats Up the Oven for the Annual Bread Bake

Kids Helping Kids (KHK) members are ready to go back into the kitchen for a seventh season of Thanksgiving bread baking. Last year, KHK sold over 2,000 pumpkin breads and, through donations, were able to provide a local shelter with over 370 breads for Thanksgiving meals.

This year, they once again hope to outdo themselves by selling their homemade-style pumpkin breads at \$10 a loaf. All profits will go to fund future Kids Helping Kids projects.

Kids Helping Kids members will bake, package and sell the breads ~a collaboration with over 60 volunteers. The volunteers consist of middle and high school students from over 25 different schools. "This is the first year we will be baking without our founder Lexi Kelley because she is away at college," said Jordan Benzaken, a junior at Westhill High School, "so we all want to exceed last year's sale to show her that even though she is not able to directly help us, her vision continues."

The bread bake will take place on **Thursday, November 19** and **sales will begin Friday, November 20, continuing until Tuesday, November 24**. Kids Helping Kids volunteers will be selling breads to friends and family, but breads will also be available for purchase at three local destinations: **Athlete's Source**, 1097 High Ridge Road, Stamford, Fri-Tues 10-6pm, Sun 11-5; **St. Luke's School**, 377 North Wilton Rd, New Canaan, Mon. 8-3pm; and **The Dojo**, 1030 Long Ridge Road, Stamford, Fri-Tues 1-6pm, Sat 10-1pm.
