Prevent-Teach-Reinforce for Young Children (PTR-YC) (sponsored by the lowa Department of Education)

PTR-YC is a model of intervention for young children with the most persistent and severe challenging behaviors. The model is based on the well-established procedures of positive behavior support, but is designed to help providers implement the assessment and intervention strategies with a high level of fidelity, leading to improved effectiveness. PTR-YC is a process for use in early childhood care and education settings, including pre-k classrooms, and consists of teaming and goal setting, practical data collection, functional behavioral assessment, intervention planning and implementation. The steps of PTR-YC are designed to be used by early childhood providers in a classroom setting. Strategies used to facilitate learning will include: lecture, discussion, small group work and interactive work, reading from the manual, and practice opportunities for participants to engage with the process.

Child Care Grant and Proposal Writing (sponsored by First Children's Finance)

Child care center directors, administrators, and owners are invited to spend a hands-on day with First Children's Finance learning new ways to increase your success in writing excellent grant applications and funding requests. This will be an interactive approach to achieving powerful and compelling written communications for a very important audience—your partners, stakeholders, and funders. This training puts theory to practice, combining 3 hours of face-to-face training with a 3 hour outdoor environments tour. The face-to-face training will consider the multiple aspects of a safe, inclusive, and high quality early childhood outdoor environment. This time will reflect on the vital role the outdoor environment has to children's physical, social, emotional and intellectual development while also considering how a program can assure they are aligned to best practice and standards in their outdoor space.

Teaching Intentionally in the Interest Areas (Creative Curriculum) (sponsored by the Iowa Department of Education)

Preschool teachers will learn to be purposeful as they create an environment and interact with children in the interest areas and outdoors. In addition to planning the physical spaces, teachers will learn strategies for interacting with children in ways that support their development and learning related to the curricular objectives while encouraging children's explorations and creativity.

Strategies for embedding specially designed instruction in the interest areas for young children with disabilities will also be discussed.

Enhancing Leadership Skills and Directing with Vision and Clarity (sponsored by United Way of Central Iowa)

In this interactive workshop, educators will learn how to develop and strengthen key skills for supervision and powerful leadership. Topics such as observation, giving constructive feedback, developing individualized professional development plans, and conducting effective staff meetings will be covered in this rewarding course. We will help re-energize you and help you shift to a more positive and inspiring way of managing your program. Upon completion of this workshop, you will return to your program with new ideas and strategies for deeply connecting your vision and core values with the teachers, children, and families in your program.

Rae Pica has been an education consultant, specializing in the development and education of the whole child and children's physical activity, since 1980. A former adjunct instructor with the University of New Hampshire, she is the founder and director of Moving & Learning (now Rae Pica Keynotes & Consulting) and the author of 19 books, including the text *Experiences in Movement and Music* (in its 5th edition), the award-winning *Great Games for Young Children* and *Jump into Literacy*, and *A Running Start: How Play, Physical Activity, and Free Time Create a Successful Child*, written for the parents of children birth to age five. Her latest book, published by Corwin in 2015, is *What If Everybody Understood Child Development?: Straight Talk About Improving Education and Children's Lives*.

Known for her lively and informative workshop and keynote presentations, Rae has shared her expertise with many groups. She served on the task force of the National Association for Sport and Physical Education (now SHAPE America) that created national guidelines for early childhood physical activity, is a member of several advisory boards, and serves on the executive committee of the Academy of Education Arts and Sciences International. In addition, Rae is co-founder of the BAM Radio Network, the world's largest online education radio network, where she currently hosts **Studentcentricity**, interviewing experts in education, child development, play research, the neurosciences and more.


