## HOW WORKERS' COMP TRENDS IN THE LOS ANGELES REGION ARE DEFINING CALIFORNIA'S SYSTEM

As a state, California is the most expensive in the nation for workers' compensation. But the system is actually defined by two regions: the Los Angeles region and the rest of California. IN FACT, IF L.A.'S MUCH HIGHER RATE OF CLAIMS WERE REMOVED FROM CALIFORNIA'S EXPERIENCE, THE STATE WOULD FALL MUCH MORE INTO LINE WITH NATIONAL TRENDS.

The end- result is a costlier state system and a cost burden for L.A.-area employers that can be 20%

higher than elsewhere in California.
