



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NJB Transportation Technical Group Event: Interchange 14A

On April 16, 2015, ASCE's North Jersey Branch Transportation Technical Group had a large turnout for a presentation at the Crowne Plaza in Fairfield on the New Jersey Turnpike Authority's (NJTA) Interchange 14A Improvements Project. The project was presented by Lisa Navarro, P.E., NJTA, Project Manager, Michael Morgan, P.E., Gannett Fleming, Consultant Project Manager and Brian Jecker, P.E., Dewberry, Lane Control System Project Engineer. The presentation included an introduction and background of the project, followed by a detailed description of the proposed improvements to the New Jersey Turnpike's Hudson County Extension (HCE), the Interchange 14A Toll Plaza, and the free side ramp improvements, including an animated simulation showing the operation of the proposed round-about for E53rd Street. In addition, the HCE Lane Control System was discussed in detail. This Lane Control System allows for the use of the EB HCE right shoulders to be utilized as traveled lane during peak hours to handle additional traffic which was diverted to the HCE due to the closing of the EB Pulaski Skyway for rehabilitation by the NJDOT. The project is currently under construction and expected to be completed by the fall of 2018.

- A full-day Geotech Seminar, "Foundations On and In Rock" this annual event, organized by the Geotechnical Technical Group covered foundation topics in depth and awarded attendees with 8 PDHs.

The NJ Turnpike Interchange 6 to 9 Widening Project was recognized at the ASCE NJ Section Awards Dinner on May 8, 2015

NJ Turnpike Interchange 6 to 9 Widening

At \$2.3 billion covering nearly 35 miles of roadway, the New Jersey Turnpike Authority's Interchange 6 to 9 Widening Program was a massive effort to extend its dual-dual roadway south to Interchange 6. A significant benefit of the Program for the motoring public was the elimination of a chronically congested chokepoint at the southbound merge at Interchange 8A.

Final design commenced in the spring 2007. As construction contracts were finalized, they were publicly bid and awarded allowing construction of the Widening Program to begin in May 2009 and be completed in November 2014. At its peak, it was the largest active roadway construction project in the Western Hemisphere. Approximately 170 lane

miles were added, accommodating projected traffic needs through 2032. The Program included a program manager, eight major design firms, an environmental consultant, a constructability consultant, five construction management firms, numerous subconsultants, seventeen general contractors and hundreds of subcontractors and material suppliers.

The new outer roadways opened in May 2014 allowing the existing inner roadways to be closed to traffic for bridge deck repairs, median barrier repairs and roadway asphalt resurfacing. That work was completed in the fall of 2014 and the entire Widening Program opened in November 2014. It was the largest roadway capacity expansion project the Turnpike has ever

undertaken and an extremely successful one that was completed on time and under budget.
