

Is everyone familiar with their irrigation schedule? A lot of residents may not know when their sprinklers are set to come on or when they can check for any maintenance issues with their system. Victoria Park's irrigation system is vast and runs through all four quadrants. It is equipped with rain sensors. If we get enough rain, the sprinklers will not run. Rain sensors should be checked periodically to make sure they are working properly.

Issues with water pressure might imply filters need to be changed or clogged/broken heads that need to be replaced. When there is a power outage, your timer is equipped with a battery backup. This is usually a 9V or circular Lithium. This retains information but will not run the system. When the power is restored, your system should run with no issues.

When installing new landscape, we do not have the ability to allow you extra run time with the reclaimed water. You can, however, use a hose or manual sprinkler to get the water needed to help your new plants root.

Each home has their own shut off valve for the irrigation system on their property. It is usually located opposite the portable water black box. The irrigation boxes, when installed, were light purple. It is each homeowner's responsibility to know where the shut off valves are located. It is also the homeowner's responsibility to contact the management office if they are experiencing issues with their irrigation.
