**November 16: The Timucuans of North East Florida** — Join Senior Curator of Education and Curator of History James “Zach” Zacharias and learn about the history of the first “True Natives” of Northeast Florida. Learn how to identify Timucuan Pottery and artifacts and the rise and fall of Florida’s largest indigenous people.

**December 14: The Grand Dames: The Historic Hotels of Florida** — Florida’s sands, sun and laid-back lifestyle have attracted hoteliers for ages. These storied hotels of yesteryear, all still welcoming guests, take a modern day tour and learn about the history of these historic luxury hotels from around the state with James “Zach” Zacharias Senior Curator of Education and Curator of History.

**January 11: Masterwork Landscape Paintings from the Cici and Hyatt Brown Collection of Art** — Join James “Zach” Zacharias Senior Curator of Education and Curator of History and learn about Florida History through the historic masterwork paintings of the Cici and Hyatt Brown Collection of Art. The Brown Collection is the largest collection of historical Florida Landscape paintings in the world dating from 1835 to 2000. Take a journey through Florida’s history and discover art, science and history through these amazing paintings.

**February 8: Dragons from Deep Time** — They are like nothing alive today, they are ferocious, immense, and from a lost world. Discover humanities fascination with prehistoric carnivores that once ruled the land. Learn how these exotic prehistoric animals lived and died through the fossil they left behind. Join James “Zach” Zacharias Senior Curator of Education and Curator of History for a hands-on experience with fossils from these amazing creatures like Tyrannosaurus Rex, Mosasaur, giant crocs, and others from the last 300 million years.

**March 14: Astronomy through the ages** — Astronomy is the oldest of the natural sciences, dating back to antiquity, with it’s origins in the religious realm. Join Curator of Astronomy Seth Mayo and learn the history of astronomy and about the astronomers who changed our view of the Universe. Learn about the Copernicus, Ptolemy, Galileo and other amazing advances from the first telescopes to the latest imaging process.

**April 11: Back in the Day 20th Century Artifacts** — Join Assistant Curator of Education and Science Luis Zengotita for a look at artifacts that once dominated the lives of every house holds across America from the las100 years. Learn the history and science behind some of the museum’s collection of artifacts that you may have once used “back in the day” from the gramophones, transistor radios, rotary phones to an 18-pound hand iron to press your clothes. Take a trip down memory lane with these once important conveniences and luxury items.
