#### Paul M. Sethi, MD



Dr. Sethi is an orthopedic surgeon with Orthopaedic and Neurosurgery Specialists in Greenwich. He was an all-lvy League athlete and graduated with honors from Cornell University. He received his medical degree from Mount Sinai School of Medicine and completed an internship and residency at Yale University. He completed a sports medicine fellowship at Kerlan Jobe Orthopaedic Institute in Los Angeles, CA, and was

assistant team physician for the Los Angeles Lakers basketball team, Los Angeles Kings hockey team, the Los Angeles Dodgers and the Univ. of Southern California football team.

Board-certified by the American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgery, Dr. Sethi is on the faculty at Yale University School of Medicine, where he teaches advanced techniques in sports medicine surgery. He is currently team physician for Greenwich High School and Iona Preparatory High School.

### Tricia McDonough Ryan, PhD



A practicing pediatric neuropsychologist, Dr. Ryan specializes in the diagnosis and treatment of traumatic brain injury (TBI) in children and adolescents. She completed undergraduate work at Cornell University and received a Doctorate at University of Cincinnati. She did her residency at the Atlanta VA Hospital, working with veterans suffering from a TBI. Her post-doctoral fellowship was completed at Cincinnati Children's

Hospital Medical Center, where she specialized in pediatric neuropsychology.

During her tenure as Assistant Professor of Pediatrics at Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center, Dr. Ryan led the outpatient rehabilitation program that provided comprehensive treatment to children recovering from TBI, brain tumor, stroke and other neurological disease. Dr. Ryan provided neuropsychological assessment and concussion consultations for the NFL Cincinnati Bengals Football Team.
