



CTR-IN *ADVANCE TO FUNDING PROGRAM* REVIEWER RECRUITMENT

The CTR-IN is recruiting reviewers to provide NIH-quality reviews of four proposals being prepared for submission to the NIH for February 2016 deadlines. Reviewers will prepare NIH style reviews and scores (Overall, Significance, Investigators, Innovation, Approach, Environment, and Additional Review Criteria including Protection of Human Subjects). In addition to the written reviews, we will schedule a video conference call Study Section.

Reviewers will receive a consultant fee of \$200 upon completion of the review process. (Reviewers must be either a U.S. Citizen or a lawful “permanent” resident, i.e. green card holder to receive a consultant fee.)

The CTR-IN has implemented the confidentiality and non-disclosure policies of the NIH. Specifically, proposals and associated materials made available to reviewers, reviewer evaluations, and discussion that takes place during review meetings, are confidential and must not be disclosed to or discussed with any individual who has not been officially designated to participate in the review process.

- Characterization of topoisomerase I as a narrow-spectrum anti-streptococcal target – R15 A1 or R03 - Infectious disease, basic microbiology - **Reviews due January 18. Conference call on or about January 25.**
- Impact of Periodontal Disease on Inflammation and Bone Disease in Diabetes – R21 - Biomarkers, Health Systems, Metabolic/Obesity, Diabetes, Prevention, Vulnerable Populations - **Reviews due January 18. Conference call on or about January 25.**
