

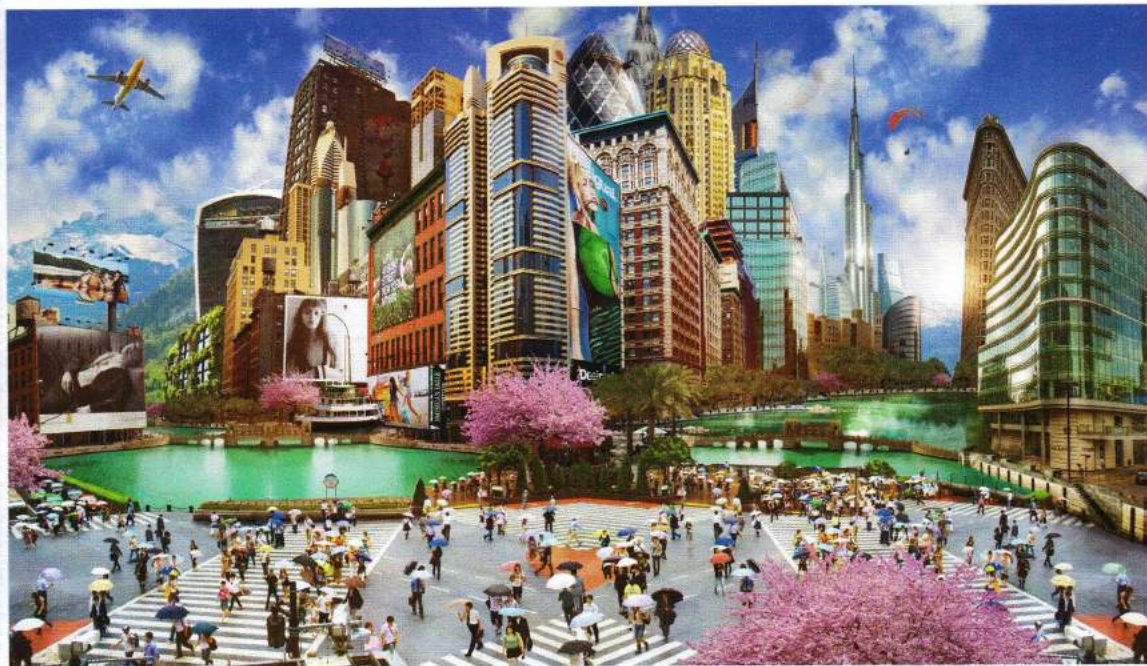

AN AFFAIR TO REMEMBER

NOW IN ITS FIFTH YEAR, **ART SOUTHAMPTON** HAS BECOME A CAN'T-MISS DESTINATION FOR LOCAL AND INTERNATIONAL AESTHETES. **BY STEPHANIE MURG**

A giant ice cream bar juxtaposed against a wooden stick licked clean of its frozen goodness will whet the appetites of collectors at this year's Art Southampton. The glossy white sculpture, *Now You See It...*, by the duo of Tim Berg and Rebekah Myers and exhibited by Miami Beach's Dean Project, nods to the age of Snapchat and the ephemerality of an art fair. It's a reminder to make the most of the five days that artworks from more than 60 galleries will fill the grounds of Nova's Ark Project in Bridgehampton.

"The diversity, quality, international artist rosters, and long-standing reputations of the participating galleries set Art Southampton apart," says Nicholas Korniloff, director of the fair and its parent company, Art Miami. Special attractions

for the fifth edition include an entrance designed by Water Mill-based landscape architect Christopher LaGuardia, a VIP lounge, and an emphasis on artists of the East End, from Willem de Kooning to Eric Fischl.

From Southampton's McNeill Art Group, Beth McNeill is showing new works by local artists Perry Burns and Jeff Muhs, whose smushed Ducati-and-concrete sculpture will stand totemlike in the fair's sculpture garden. She is also adding a fashionable twist in the form of artist Kevin Berlin's top hats, a corset sculpture by Adriana Carvalho, and her own outfits, which will be on sale in partnership with the vintage-clothing dealer Morphew. *Art Southampton takes place July 7–11 at Nova's Ark Project, 60 Millstone Road, Bridgehampton; art-southampton.com* ■

Art Southampton, now in its fifth edition, continues to redefine what a summer weekend getaway to the Hamptons should include. For many, the phrase "spending a weekend in the Hamptons" paints a vivid picture of beaches and tennis courts, streets lined with palatial seaside retreats and quaint boutiques, and raucous crowds at celebrity parties and local clam shacks—but there's plenty of art to see, too. The fair opens to the public on Friday, July 8th, and will play host to over 60 galleries, curated exhibitions, and a series of expert-led panels and talks exploring various aspects of the art world. Many of the artists and works offered at this year's fair also play with the idea of tradition, manipulating media, themes, and reworking familiar images from art history to examine the role that tradition plays in the creation of contemporary art. The 5th annual **Art Southampton** will take place on Thursday, July 7th through Monday, July 11th at **Nova's Art Project** in Bridgehampton. The Opening Night VIP Preview will occur on July 7th from 7:30 to 10 p.m., where guests can enjoy a sneak peek at the Fair, as well as cocktails and hors d'oeuvres. Tickets to the VIP Preview are \$150, and proceeds from the evening will benefit the **Parrish Art Museum** and **Southampton Hospital**.

Art Southampton continually strives to provide the most seamless, inspiring, and enjoyable experience for Hamptonites. There are art shows occurring all throughout the summer months, but there's something about Art Southampton that makes it so unique. David Kratz and Brooke Shields will co-curate *Call of the Wild* and will also host an independent cocktail reception to discuss the alumni's paintings, prints, and sculptures, themed around the animal kingdom and natural world.

Art crowd heads to the Hamptons for Art Southampton

Actress Brooke Shields co-organises show of wildlife-themed art alongside art fair

Each summer weekend, New York's elite turn the Upper East Side into a ghost town as they migrate east to the vacation towns a few hours into Long Island that comprise the Hamptons. Art Southampton, the premier fair serving that demographic in those months, kicks off its fifth edition with 70 galleries and a number of high-profile attractions, among them an exhibition co-curated by New York Academy of Art (NYAA) president David Kratz and the actress Brooke Shields. The fair, which is in the grounds of Bridgehampton's Nova's Ark Project, opens today (7 July) and runs until 11 July.

Shields's contribution represents a longstanding relationship the fair has had with the NYAA, and will include more than 30 paintings, prints and sculptures by the college alumni on the animal kingdom (Call of the Wild). And she isn't the only celebrity attraction. The actor Adrien Brody, star of *The Pianist*, will show another installment of his *Hooked* series, for which he plastered posters around Manhattan during Frieze New York, while the *Shark Tank* host Kevin O'Leary will present his own photography offerings.

This year's Art Southampton includes 70 galleries, fewer than last year's edition, which featured more than 90. The director Nick Korniloff—founder of Art Miami, which presents Art Southampton — said this edition could have had as many galleries but "we turned away a lot because they didn't meet the criteria or quality level we were looking for." Most dealers come from the US, with a handful from Europe and Asia, including Cynthia Corbett gallery in London, Rademakers Gallery in Amsterdam and iPreciation from Singapore.

Korniloff cited the current performance of the stock market, the impending US election, and Brexit as factors affecting the art market, though pointed out that anecdotally he had noticed more people staying in the Hamptons rather than travelling to Europe this year.

"The balance of the work is much more in tune with what is being created today in the contemporary market, by younger, living artists," Korniloff says. "The balance of secondary market and primary is pretty much even whereas in the past it's been a little more heavily weighted on secondary market material. There's still great representation by Hamptons artists," he adds, referring to artists such as Willem de Kooning and Eric Fischl who have lived and worked in the area.

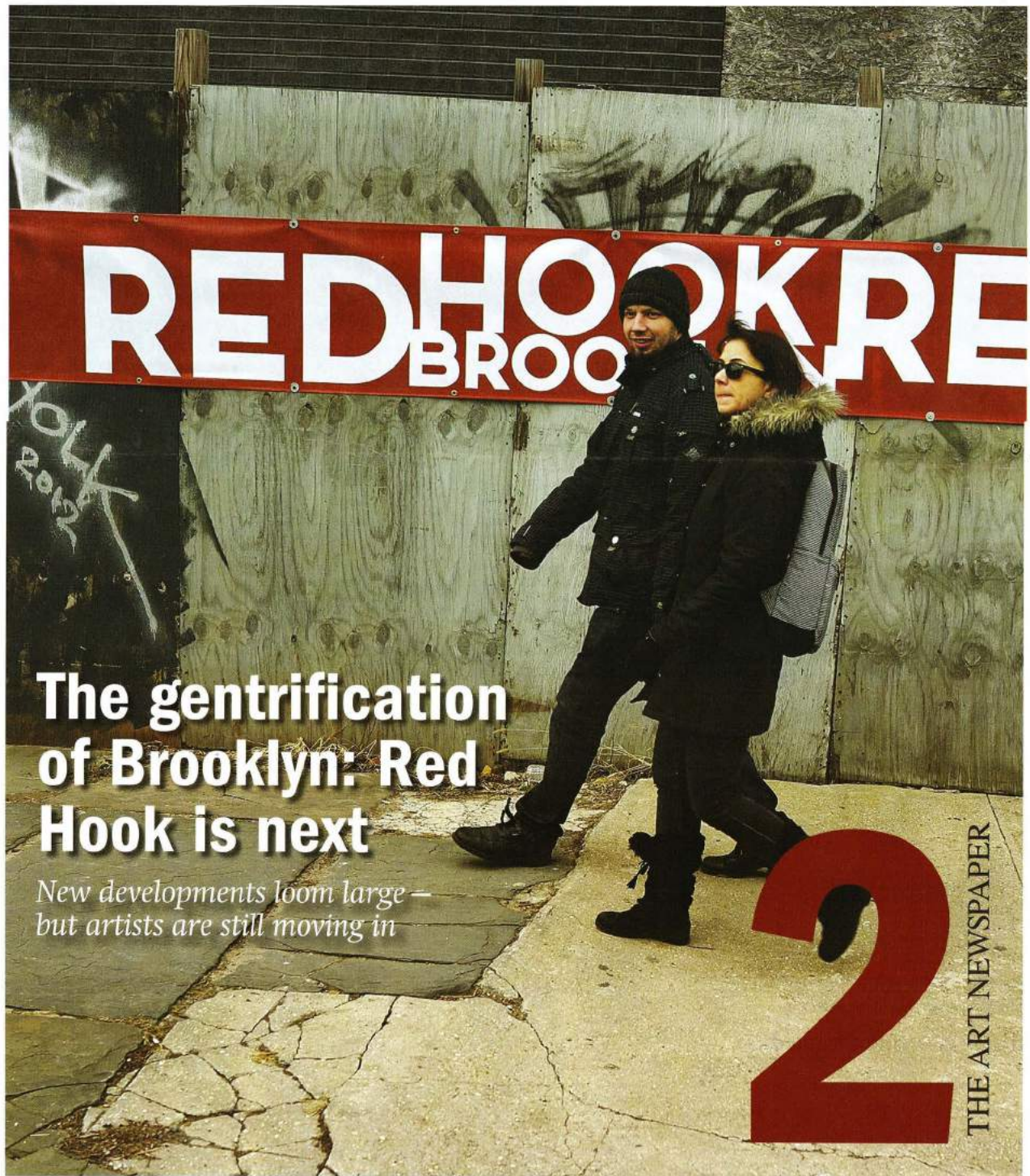

Seattle. Against the grain of the art market's traditional summer slowdown, the Seattle Art Fair is growing after a successful launch last year. Forty-six newcomers, including New York's Pace/MacGill and Marlborough galleries, are among more than 80 exhibitors (up from 62) participating in the second edition this August. co-founder of Microsoft, the fair aims to nurture the "budding collector base" in the region, says its director, Max Fishko. "We plan to make it a magnet for collectors from the Pacific Rim and from around the US."

The exhibitor list is suitably mixed, with 24 galleries from the West Coast, 27 from the East Coast, six from the central US and 18 international galleries. The New York- and London-based David Zwirner,

New York's Pace and the local dealer Mariane Ibrahim are among the 35 exhibitors returning, motivated by "the enthusiastic response and strong sales" last year, a spokesman for Pace says.

"We have fine hopes for our first year," says Doug McClellmont, the director of Marlborough in New York. The gallery will show a new installation by the Seattle-based glass artist

Dale Chihuly, who founded the Chihuly Garden and Glass museum in 2012 next to the city's landmark Space Needle. The artist "already has a huge presence in Seattle, which is one of the factors that led us to join the fair", McClellmont adds.

Meanwhile, the Los Angeles-based writer and curator Laura Fried has taken up the new role of artistic director, organising talks and projects that will "spotlight the cross-pollination among diverse practices from LA to Vancouver", from sculpture and performance writer and curator Laura Fried has taken up the new role of artistic director, organising talks and projects that will "spotlight the cross-pollination among diverse practices from LA to Vancouver", from sculpture and performance

to architecture and technology, she says. Fried's programme will also extend into the city, with a sound piece and choral performance by the musician Brendan Fowler in Pioneer Square.

The fair, which is co-produced by Allen's philanthropic investment firm Vulcan and Art Market Productions, signals that the "summer slowdown in the art business... is not as prevalent as previously thought", Fishko says. "The summer is a great time to be in Seattle."

Art Stage Jakarta makes its debut

The Singapore spin-off will focus on Indonesian art

ART FAIRS

Jakarta. Art Stage Jakarta, a spin-off of Art Stage Singapore, will provide "a window and a bridge" between Indonesia's art scene and the world, says Lorenzo Rudolf, the president and founder of both fairs. The inaugural edition is due to open in the Indonesian capital on 5 August.

The archipelago of 260 million people has "the biggest art market in Southeast Asia, and the biggest Asian collector base after China", Rudolf says. Its lively artist community benefits from a loyal base of local collectors and public support, but lacks international exposure and a strong gallery infrastructure. "Being closed off means Indonesian artists do not copy Western stars," Rudolf adds.

Times are changing, as the country's first international Modern and contemporary art museum prepares to open in Jakarta in March 2017. Rudolf predicts the Museum MACAN, founded and backed by the Indonesian philanthropist and collector Haryanto Adikoesoemo, "will be the most important contemporary art museum in Southeast Asia".

But the flavour of the first Art Stage Jakarta is local. Fifty galleries – mostly from Southeast Asia and 16 from Indonesia – have confirmed their participation so far, the organisers say. The director Leo Silitonga says the fair will "first and foremost present Modern and contemporary art from Indonesia".

Indonesian collectors including Dedy Kusuma, Tom Tandio and Melani Setiawan are lending works to a separate 600 sq m section organised by the curator Enin Supriyanto. This will include

Indonesian artists such as the painter I Nyoman Masriadi and the performer Melati Suryodarmo as well as China's Zhang Xiaogang, the Philippines' Ronald Ventura and Japan's Ryōji Ikeda.

Art Stage Jakarta joins the existing Indonesian fairs Art Jog, a festival staged by artists working in Jogjakarta, and Bazaar Art Jakarta, which was established in 2009 and formerly directed by Silitonga. This year's edition of Bazaar Art runs just weeks after Art Stage, from 25 to 28 August. "At first we approached them to co-operate, and they agreed," Rudolf says. This idea fell through but, he says, "it was never my intention to work against them."

Art Stage Jakarta's relationship with its Singapore parent will be complementary, Rudolf says, reflecting the balance between Indonesia's rich culture and Singapore's international infrastructure. Although Art Stage Singapore has developed a platform for Southeast Asian art since 2011, "if Jakarta remains more for Indonesia, that is OK", he says.

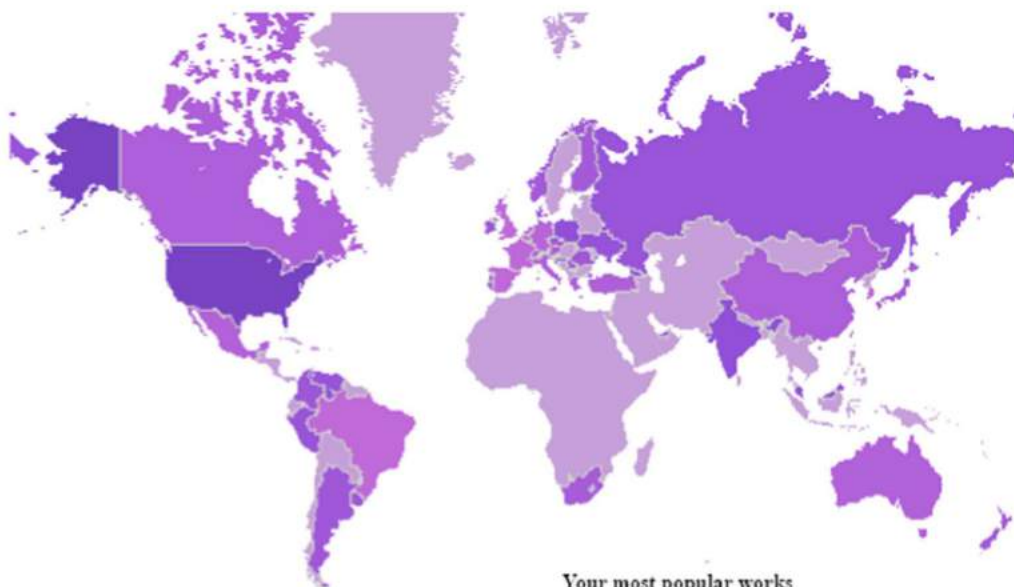
