World Day of Prayer – September 1

Responding to <u>Pope Francis' call</u>, today we join Catholics around the world in a "World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation". The day provides us with "a

precious opportunity to renew our personal participation in this vocation as custodians of creation, raising to God our thanks for the marvelous works that [God] has entrusted to our care..." We invite you to join us in prayer using this <u>prayer service</u>. In his encyclical *Laudato Si'*, Pope Francis reminds us that our faith tradition calls us to

embrace a consciousness of "integral ecology," which respects the fundamental interconnectedness of the economy, society and environment. "We are part of nature, included in it and thus in constant interaction with it." May our prayers help us understand this interconnectedness and inspire action in support of all God's creation.

Season of Creation

The Global Catholic Climate Movement invites us to extend the spirit of Pope Francis' *World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation* into a *Season of Creation* beginning September 1 and concluding October 4, the

Clean Power Plan

On August 3, President Obama and the EPA announced the Clean Power Plan – an historic and important step in reducing carbon pollution from power plants that takes real

action on climate change. As you know, power plants are the number-one source of greenhouse gas emissions in the U.S. But some members of Congress are gearing up to weaken these national standards on carbon

Autumnal Equinox – September 23

Equinox, from the Latin for equal night, occurs twice a year, spring and fall, when the tilt of the Earth's axis and Earth's orbit around the sun combine in such a way that night and day are approximately equal in length.

The autumnal equinox reminds us that summer is over and winter is coming on the northern half of Earth's globe. Birds and butterflies are migrating south. All around us, trees and plants are ending this year's cycle of growth. Perhaps this is also a time for members of the human community to reflect on their own season of growth, their own need for a time of harvesting and of letting go, their own preparation for wintering time.

Iran Nuclear Deal – Catholic Sisters Speak Out

Last month the United States, United Kingdom, the Russian Federation, China, Germany, and France reached a historic agreement with Iran that aims to curb Iran's development of nuclear weapons while allowing the use of nuclear energy for peaceful purposes. As Congress moves to consider the agreement, now is the time to let your voice be heard on this matter. Over 1,000 U.S. Catholic Sisters have signed onto a letter urging support for the deal, "As women of faith, followers of the one who said, "Blessed are the peacemakers" (Mt 5:9), we urge that you risk on the

International Day for the Total Elimination of Nuclear Weapons

Achieving global nuclear disarmament is one of the oldest goals of the United Nations. Yet today, some 17,000 nuclear weapons remain. These facts provide the foundation for the General Assembly's designation of September 26 as the International Day for the Total Elimination of Nuclear Weapons. This Day provides an occasion for the world community to reaffirm its commitment to global nuclear disarmament as a high priority. Trafficking in Persons – Help Shine a Light

This year's <u>Trafficking in Persons Report</u> places a special emphasis on human trafficking in the global marketplace. It highlights the hidden risks that workers may encounter when seeking employment and the steps that governments and businesses can take to prevent trafficking, including a demand for transparency in global supply chains. In response, we urge you to

contact your members of Congress and ask them to cosponsor the Business Supply Chain Transparency on Trafficking and Slavery Act of 2015. This legislation would require companies to make information about their products' supply chains public to ensure their products are not the result of child and forced labor, slavery and human trafficking. This legislation is supported by

the USCCB, CRS, ICCR and others – learn more/take action.

International Literacy Day

Approximately 775 million people worldwide are functionally illiterate. To promote awareness in the hope of one day eradicating this ongoing human rights violation, the UN designated September 8 as International Literacy Day. This year's theme is Literacy and Sustainable Societies. Literacy is a key driver for sustainable development. Literacy skills are the prerequisite for the learning of a broader set of knowledge, skills, attitudes and values, required for creating sustainable societies. At the same time,

In a ruling filed on August 21, Federal Judge Dolly Gee of the Central District of California, ordered the release of children and their parents from immigration detention centers unless they are a significant flight risk or a danger to others, giving officials two months to comply. She called the centers "deplorable" and "failing to meet even the minimal standard for safe and sanitary conditions".
