
# Leaving Your Legacy By Lynne Peterson




I recommend two books on leaving your legacy. Copies of each will be in the church library and on the church's book sale display.

Parents' Night Out (PNO) is a church ministry for parents and their children. PNO is a cooperative child care program, where we take turns watching one another's children on Saturday evenings from 5:30–8:30 pm. It's an amazing ministry and fellowship group. Through PNO, we grow closer to other families by working together with other parents as we care for one another's children.

We operate in 16-week trimesters where parents from each family work four Saturdays during the trimester (just once a



month!) with another couple. Then for the remainder of the Saturdays, we drop off our children and have a "Parents' Night Out" on our own, or sometimes with other couples from the group.

As with all church groups that care for children, PNO complies with the Safe Church program guidelines.
