We started our program with a buddy for one child, and now we have buddies serving four children with varying needs every Sunday. As we prepare for Vacation Bible School, we have nine children who will need buddies. Nine! God is growing our ministry rapidly, and our need for buddies has increased. We are looking for youth and adults who are willing to be trained to work with a specific child with special needs.

Buddies also make it possible for parents to fully participate in worship and praise the God who sustains them. Worshiping with a church community is a gift many of us take for granted. For a family of a child with special needs, church can be the place that they long to be but are not fully accepted. Thankfully SVPC is supporting these families and attracting families from the community through our inclusive church school classes and buddy program. It is a joy to see these parents grow as part of our church family. This would not be possible without our buddies.



Habitat and Presbyterian Women Connect

Since buying land here is prohibitive, the East Bay/Silicon Valley chapter has a new plan to partner with individuals and families to repair their manufactured homes. Many owners are elderly or disabled and cannot afford maintenance, even if a home is unsafe.

To implement the plan Habitat for Humanity applied for a PC(USA) Presbyterian Women 2016 Birthday

Offering grant. **Sue Slavik** and **Miriam Kishi** provided references and from among many applications, Habitat for Humanity was chosen as one of four projects to share this year's offering.

Habitat for Humanity East Bay/Silicon Valley gives families with limited incomes the opportunity to purchase or repair a home at a price affordable to them. Habitat home owners work together with volunteers like you to build or repair homes—over 50 families will be assisted this year. Teams



are beginning the foundation of a brand new home on Delmas Avenue in Willow Glen and repairing dozens of homes across San Jose. Volunteer workdays are 8:30 AM-4 PM. Volunteers can also sign up to serve lunch.

Parent's Night Out—What is it?

Parents' Night Out (PNO) is a church ministry for parents and their children. PNO is a cooperative child care program, where parents take turns watching one another's children on Saturday evenings from 5:30–8:30 PM. It's an amazing ministry and fellowship group. Through PNO, participating families have grown closer as they work together and care for one another's children.



We operate in 16-week trimesters where parents from each family work four Saturdays during the trimester (just once a month) with another couple. Then for the remainder of the Saturdays, we drop off our children and have a "Parent's Night Out" on our own or sometimes with other couples from the group.

As with all church groups that care for children, Parent's Night Out complies with the Safe Church program guidelines.
