Ministry Renewal Team Update Jean Ranck

Five months ago, nine members of our congregation—myself included— answered the call to be part of the Ministry Renewal Team (MRT).

Our first task was to talk to as many people in our community as possible. Through more than 35 meetings we heard from over 300 people including program and support staff, elders and deacons, long-time members, new members and visitors, young adults, high school and middle school students and more. Next we interviewed ministry partners and community leaders including the Presbyterian Early Learning Center (PELC), Bill Wilson Center, Sunnyvale Community Services, a high school principal, and the mayor of Sunnyvale.

On June 7 we launched a survey with questions formed from the responses we received from the reflection discussions we conducted in April and May. The survey

ran for three weeks and we received 305 hardcopy and online responses. The results from the survey are now posted on the church's website.

In July we started the somewhat daunting task of prayerfully synthesizing and analyzing all the responses we collected. We greatly appreciate the time and thoughtfulness with which you responded to our questions, both in the discussions and on the survey. To give you an idea of just how much you did respond, one open-ended question on the survey, "What are your hopes

for our church's future?" generated eleven pages of responses!

The next steps for the MRT are to complete the analysis and write a Mission Study Report by September which, once approved by Session and the Presbytery, will be used by the Pastor Nominating Committee in their search for the next head pastor.

Thank you for entrusting this important work to the MRT. We greatly appreciate your continued support and prayers.



Where We Are In Our Time of Transition

In January, Session formed and commissioned the Ministry Renewal Team to help the congregation reflect on who SVPC is as the family of God in our congregation, the community, and beyond. Their efforts, together with those of our congregation and ministry partners over the past months, are coalescing into a Mission Study Report that Session hopes to receive in final form as early as

September.

In late March of this year, our interim pastor, **Debbie Whaley**, joined us and has brought an engaging and inclusive presence to SVPC, relating with congregants both individually as well as in the many groups that make up our church community. In addition, Debbie has connected with and is listening to our staff and is actively involving herself in the day-to-day

processes of our church. Together with the church staff and the Personnel Committee, she has been reviewing staff roles and responsibilities. The result of these activities is an overview of staffing presented to Session in August.

As we move into the fall, Session will reflect on the Mission Study Report. This time is crucial not only to develop the vision put forth in the report, but also to discern the staffing and budgetary implications of implementing this vision. As this is comprehended, it will be communicated to the congregation, and then the Mission Study Report will be submitted to Presbytery. In parallel, the Nominating Committee will begin the process for receiving and selecting candidates for the Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC).

The hoped-for result of all of these orchestrated activities is the seating of a PNC by early 2016.

PELC Families Collect School Supplies




My Service Trip to Ecuador
