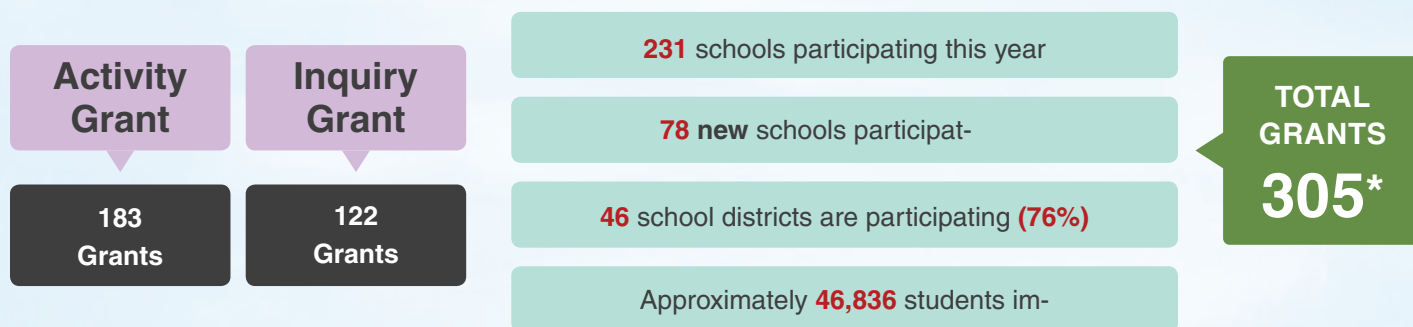


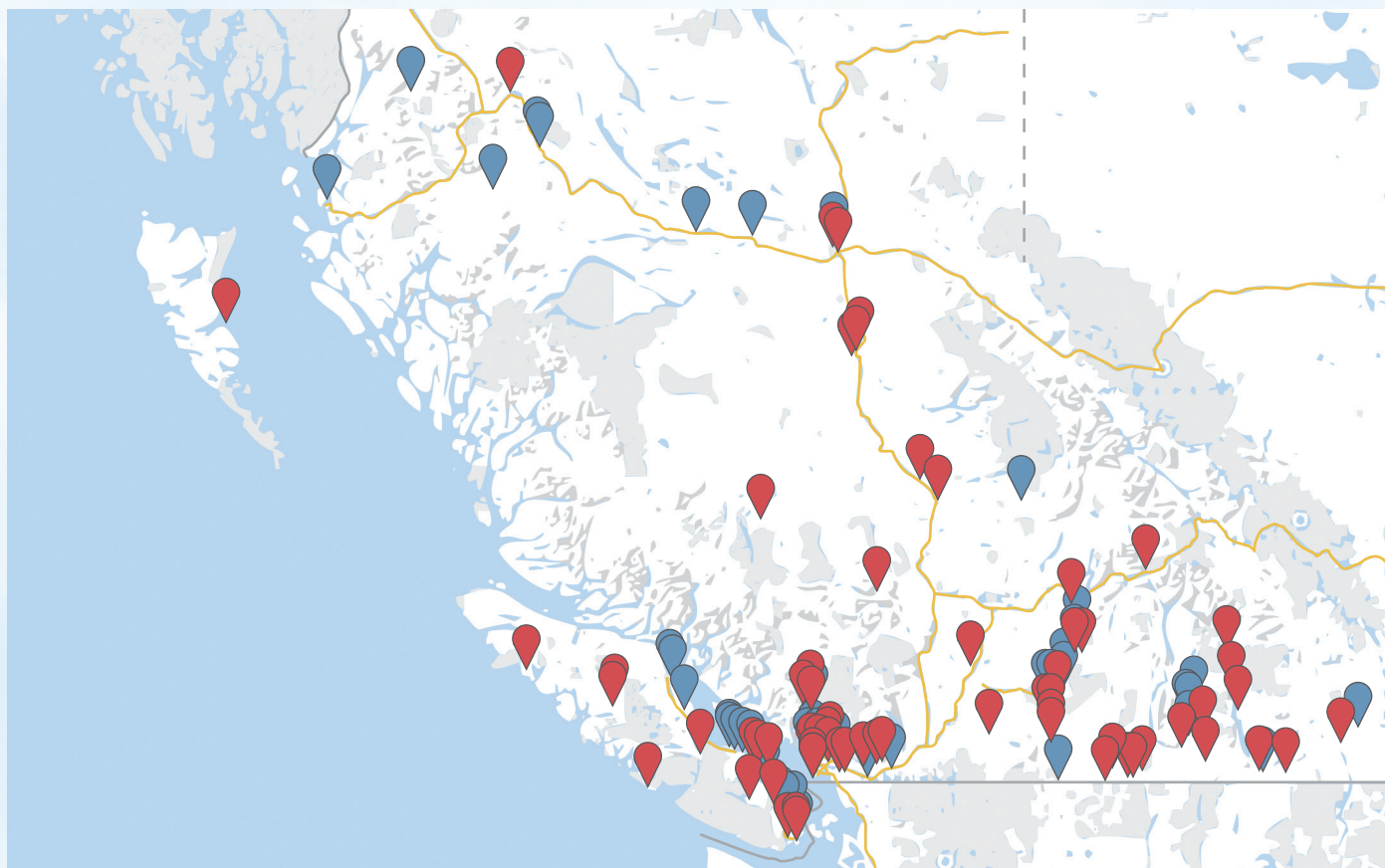
Healthy Schools Network – Mid-Year Summary Report 2014/2015

The HSN is an open learning community of educators, students, and community members across the province who are working together to optimize health and learning, meet healthy living goals, and improve overall well-being in students and the broader school community. HSN participants lead inquiry and sustainable project-based learning initiatives in their school communities, and share their stories to support and inspire others. *Funded projects positively impact students both directly (i.e. student leadership) and indirectly (i.e. positive changes to the school environment).*



*For the second consecutive year, we reached our funding capacity (or maximum number of grants) for the 2014 / 2015 school year prior to the March 1, 2015 deadline.

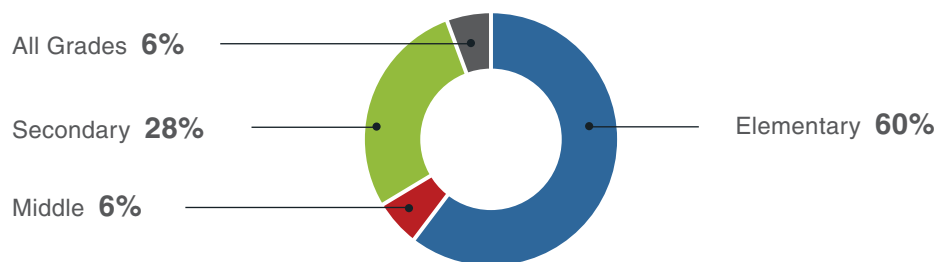

What are HSN Schools Focusing on?

Focus of Healthy Living Activities and Inquiries

40% of the healthy eating grants have a focus on hands-on food-related skills such as gardening, cooking and food preparation.

Schools are fostering healthy relationships through focusing on relationships between students, relationships between students and adults, social and emotional wellbeing, positive mental health, leadership, peer-to-peer learning opportunities and peer helping.

Examples of focuses within healthy practices include social media safety, self-regulation, bike safety, brushing teeth and more!

School connectedness is about creating a school community where everyone feels safe, seen, heard, supported, significant and cared for. Learn more about school connectedness [here](#).

A number of activities and inquiries are occurring in partnership with other organizations and initiatives to optimize learning opportunities.
