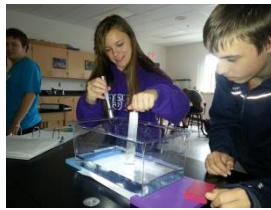

ART PROGRAMS

Visual Arts Camp
Students Entering Grades 2-5

This visual arts summer enrichment program is perfect for young artists who want to express their creativity and explore various techniques in art. This week-long program will familiarize students with a variety of mediums, including pencil, charcoal, watercolor and acrylic paint. We will explore the elements of art and the principles of design through many projects. Students will briefly be introduced to the art of bookbinding to create personal portfolios for their work. Throughout the program students will learn about the importance of line, value, texture and color in their artwork.

Beginning with a visit to a local art museum (location to be determined closer to the start of the camp) and being inspired by famous artists and their work, all students will have the opportunity to design and create their own projects. There is no limit to what they can create. A variety of art materials will be provided so that they will be encouraged to work in the medium of their choice. Beyond that they will also receive any necessary instruction, encouragement, and support to see their ideas come to life. We will end with an ice cream social and art show so the students will get a chance to display their final products.

Kick Start Band Camp
Students Entering Grades 4-5

8:00AM-3:00PM
August 22 – 23 Monday – Tuesday

Cost: \$25 (SRSD students)
\$30 (non SRSD students)

This two day camp will be catered to students going into 4th or 5th grade who have never played a band instrument before. By the end of the second day of camp students will be able to assemble their instruments, read notes and rhythms on a music staff, and put on a short performance for their parents. Kick Start is on August 22nd and 23rd from 8AM-3PM at Sanborn Regional High School. Students will need to bring a lunch, a pencil, and their instrument if they are not renting one from Music and Arts. On the first day students will receive their previously ordered Music and Arts band instrument and music book.

All students will need to buy their own Standard of Excellence Band Method Book. Books will be available for purchase (\$7) on the first day of camp.

For families who have a financial hardship, please speak to your building administrator. Our goal is that every student, regardless of their financial situation, is able to participate in the Kick Start days.

If they would like to participate in band they must have played their band instrument for at least one year. (Band instruments include: flute, clarinet, saxophone, trumpet, trombone, baritone, and percussion.) We will play and sing a wide variety of fun and challenging music, such as concert, popular and rock style pieces, and host a concert on the last day. Students will be able to choose classes on the first day of camp.

Middle School Band & Chorus Program
Students Entering Grades 7-9

Middle School Band and Chorus Program is open to all students who have just finished 6th, 7th, and 8th grades. Classes offered are Band, Chorus, theory, keyboard, percussion ensemble, guitar, and ukulele. Students participating in Band need to have played their band instrument for at least one year. (Band instruments include: flute, clarinet, bass clarinet, alto/tenor/baritone saxophone, oboe, bassoon, trumpet/cornet, French horn, trombone, euphonium, baritone, tuba and percussion.) On the first day students will choose their classes. We will play and sing a wide variety of fun and challenging music, such as concert, popular and jazz style pieces, and will host a public performance on August 19th.

- Tylenol or generic acetaminophen for pain, headache, or fever
- Bacitracin ointment or generic to wounds
- Caladryl lotion or generic for minor rash or insect bites
- Hydrocortisone cream 1% for minor rash or insect bites
- Topical oral anesthetic (Orasol, Ambesol, or generic) for minor dental pain
- Mylanta, Tums, or generic for minor stomach upset
- Throat lozenges / cough drops, for minor sore throat or cough

NOTE: If a parent / guardian requests administration of non-prescription medication not noted in the above list, the medication should be brought to the Health Office in the original container by a parent / guardian and a Hold Harmless form should be completed.
