Aimee Meredith Cox is a cultural anthropologist and tenured professor of African and African American Studies at Fordham University. She received her PhD in Anthropology from the University of Michigan where she also held a postdoctoral fellowship with the Center for the Education of Women. Her first book is *Shapeshifters: Black Girls and the Choreography of Citizenship*. She is on the editorial board of *The Feminist Wire* and on the founding editorial board of *Public: A Journal of Imagining America*. Aimee is also an executive board member of the Association of Black Anthropologists and former co-editor of *Transforming Anthropology*. In addition, she trained with the Dance Theatre of Harlem and toured extensively as a professional dancer with the Alvin Ailey Repertory Ensemble/Ailey II.
