TOP STUDENTS HONORED

The undergraduate requirements to be in the Delta Mu Delta Chapter at Ashland University are to have completed half of the requirements toward a baccalaureate degree in business administration, earn a cumulative grade point average of a 3.5 or higher and be in the top 10% of the class.

Delta Mu Delta recognizes graduate students as well. The requirements for graduate students are to have completed half of the requirements toward a graduate degree in business administration, earn a cumulative grade point average of a 3.8 or higher on a 4.0 scale, and be in the top 10% of the class. Lisa Ormiston, an MBA student shared with us about what helped her to accomplish being part of such an honor. Lisa said, “My work ethic definitely helped me get the grades to be able to be considered for Delta Mu Delta. The professors I have worked with and the students I've been in classes with have been a tremendous help as well.
