Individual Packs and Den Chiefs were recognized for their participation.



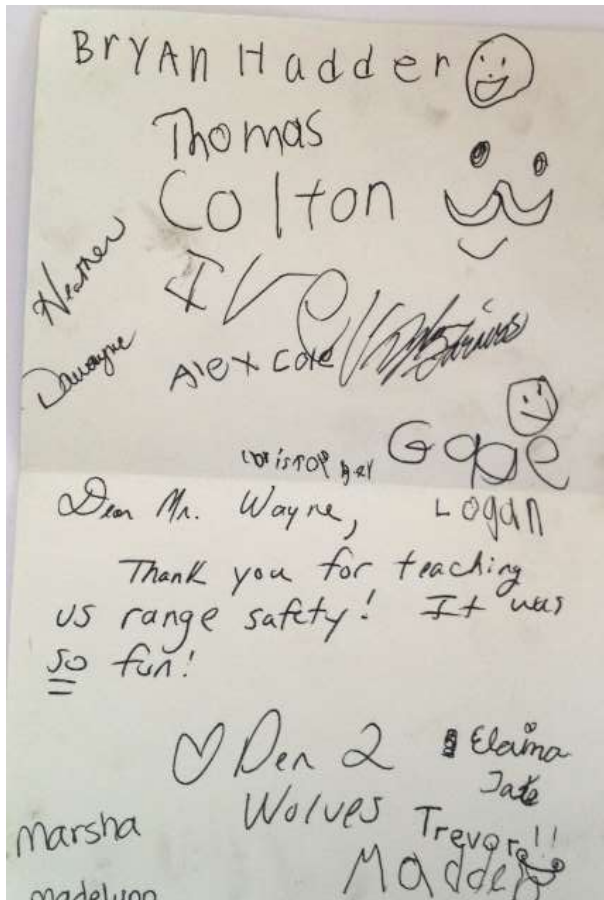
