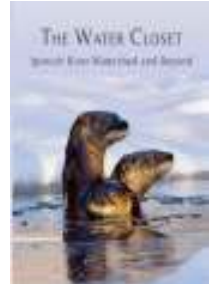


AQUATIC APRIL AND MAY OVERFLOW
