A Cultural Teaching Series by Kumu Hula, Kehaulani Kekua Hosted by Christ Memorial Episcopal Church in Kilauea for the Community

WHAT:

The public is invited to attend an exciting series of cultural workshops that will highlight the history, life and experiences of Hawai`i's beloved ali`i. Entitled, "No Nā Lani" or "For the Heavenly Chiefs", the series will feature three cultural workshops that will give participants an opportunity to learn about Queen Lili`uokalani, King Kamehameha IV and Queen Emma, their roles and contributions to Hawai`i Nei, their connections to Kaua`i Island through the sharing of mo`olelo (stories), mele oli and mele hula (chants and dances), as well as himeni (selected hymns).

Presented by Kumu Hula, Kehaulani Kekua of Halau Palaihiwa O Kaipuwai, the workshops will lead up to Christ Memorial's annual celebration commemorating King Kamehameha IV and Queen Emma as the Holy Sovereigns of the Episcopal Church of
