Creation Care at Camp Mokule`ia

Eligibility	Young adults, ages 21-30 All Christian denominations and unaffiliated welcome
Where	Camp Mokule`ia, Waialua, on the North Shore of O`ahu A ministry of the Episcopal Diocese of Hawai`i
When	August 1, 2015 – June 30, 2016
Benefits of Service	Stipend - \$300/mo. plus room and board, medical coverage, and limited use of a vehicle Living off the grid in a yurt
Application Deadline	January 31, 2015 (best opportunity for applicants from Hawai`i)
Description	ESC members are integrated into every aspect of Camp Mokule`ia's life. Most importantly, they are trained to deliver programmatic offerings that have a focus on living in concert with the harmony and balance of God's creation. We anticipate time commitments of: 50% program delivery; 30% Creation Care activities (on farm and garden, composting, recycling and waste vegetable oil conversion systems, community garden, etc.); 20% hospitality ministry (practicing the Presence of God through food service, housekeeping, etc.). <i>Essential to all work will be reflection centered on the question, "What does it mean to be a person of faith in a world in which God's creation truly begins to groan?"</i> Spiritual and vocational formation is integral to the EYASC experience and includes daily group devotions and journaling, as well as bi-weekly group and individual spiritual direction.
