

CAMP MOKULE'IA: 2015 DIOCESAN OPPORTUNITIES

Two Weeks of Rest, Relaxation and Renewal:

At the 2014 Diocesan Convention it was announced that in the summer of 2015 two weeks of Summer at Camp Mokule'ia will be set aside exclusively for Diocesan use. Those days are June 26 – July 10, and they are just around the corner. The vision is that individuals, groups and congregations will gather at the camp. During much of the day they will be engaged in their own specific activities, but at meal times and certain times of the day (e.g. morning and compline) we will gather as a whole. It is not too late to sign up for space and a myriad of activities that are being scheduled (see below):

Hui Pu: (Our Diocesan Summer Camp) –The theme for Hui Pu this year is: **Do Something**. So often faith seems to be just a bunch of words, but does it really make a difference? Well, it does, and our emphasis will be on actually walking the walk instead of just talking the talk. There will be elements of service, acts of kindness, faith exploration, and prayer. and....lots of fun. The dates for Hui Pu are:

- Ahe (3-5 graders): June 26-28th
- Lokahi (middle schoolers): June 28-July 3
- 'Opio (high schoolers): July 5-July 10

Ministry Weekend (June 26-28): Explore various form of ministry that enrich the life of our church:

- **Godly Play:** Godly Play is a way of telling stories of our faith so beautifully that we can wonder and reflect on them. We may discover new insight into the story and in ourselves. This weekend, Godly Play storytellers are invited to come, listen to and learn stories together, and then we will tell them to the larger community. Let's work on the desert stories and then tell them on the beach. We can go from Ur to Canaan to Egypt and back again. In addition, while gathered with Hui Pu we will also premier the saint story for Fr. Damien. Bring your family and friends and gather together with the stories and the Godly Play community.
- **Educating for Ministry (EfM)** – EfM is a an education-at-a-distance course which provides lay Episcopalians and others with the education to carry out the effective ministry to which all who are baptized are called. Folks who are interested in EfM, are presently part of EfM, or have been part of an EfM seminar group are invited to gather on this weekend to explore the notion that everything we do has potential for manifesting the love of Christ, and discover that our ministry is at hand wherever we turn, even at the beach.

Family Arts Camp Mokule'ia (July 2-5) This weekend is also open to all and the focus will be on relaxing activities from arts and crafts to cooperative games. Materials and supplies will be available for folks to use in community or take aside to work on alone or in small groups. People who have fun leisure activities can offer them as well.

The Outward Journey - Service Opportunities (June 29-July 3, and July 6-10):–

Active workers can help with an outreach project which involves restoring a cottage to be used for group gatherings and retreats. So bring your hammers and work clothes and prepare to share your service as an expression of your faith and with an attitude of worship.

The Inward Journey – Quiet time is available for personal retreats. Spiritual direction and guided meditation will be available for part of this time.
